THE STORY BEHIND THE SONG

Must Jesus Bear the Cross Alone

The original words to Must Jesus Bear the Cross Alone were written by Thomas Shepherd as a closing exhortation for a sermon he preached as Vicar in the Church of England in 1693. At this time, the poem pointed to Simon the Cyrene who carried the cross for Jesus, up the hill of Golgotha (Matt. 27:32):

Must Simon bear the cross alone,
And other saints be free?
Each saint of thine shall find his own
And there is one for me.
Whene'er it falls unto my lot,
Let it not drive me from
My God, let me ne'er be forgot
'Till though hast lov'd me home.

Those beautiful words calling each true believer to surrender, compel us to submit to Jesus' exhortation found in Luke 9:23 – "And he said to them all, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me." As time went by, hymn-tinkerers, as John Wesley called them, made their adjustments, until we now open our hymnals now and sing:

Must Jesus bear the cross alone,
and all the world go free?
No, there's a cross for everyone,
and there's a cross for me.

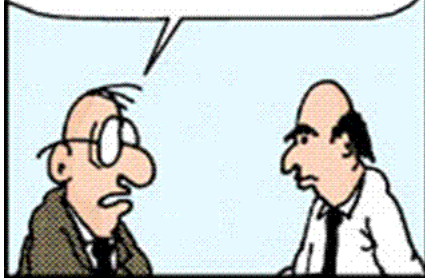
A year later, Rev. Shepherd would take up his own cross, leave his beautiful church building to become a Nonconformist and preached in a barn, proclaiming the true gospel of Jesus Christ.

Whether a minister of the gospel or a layman, each of us are called to submit to the command of Jesus to take up our cross and follow Him. We also must, in a sense, become nonconformists – not conform to this world but to conform to the image of God's Son (Rom. 8:29), who is the express image of the Father (Heb. 1:3), which is manifested as being holy (1 Pet. 1:15) and being love (1 Jn 4:8). Such nonconformity will most certainly lead to temporal loss, but it also leads to eternal and heavenly gain.

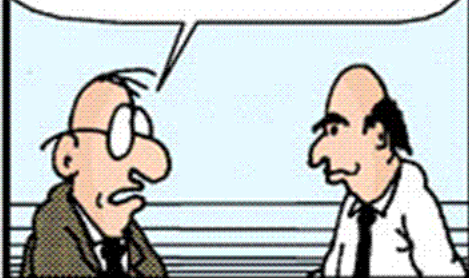
How happy are the saints above,

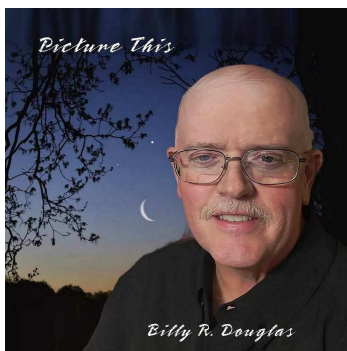

A Word to the Wise: Wise Lips or Foolish? – Prov. 10:8 – 13

“Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins.” Proverbs 10:12

Have you ever known someone who has this problem: if it comes through their mind it has to fall out of their mouth? Or if this person knows something...so will everyone else? We have some sayings in America that well describes the problems with people like that. One of them comes from the World War II era: “Loose lips sink ships,” and it refers to the dangers of unguarded speech. Such talk not only causes trouble for others, but it also shows the person for who or what they are... a “prating fool.” Before moving forward with the “prating fool,” lets look at one more American proverb and its Biblical counterpart: “Better to remain silent and be thought a fool than to open your mouth and remove all doubt.” Proverbs 17:28 “Even a fool, when he holdeth his peace, is counted wise: and he that shutteth his lips is esteemed a man of understanding.”

The term “prating fool” is only used twice in the Bible, both times in Proverbs chapter ten. “Prating fool” literally means “fool of lips” and describes one who has much foolishness to say rather than listening.

Matthew Henry adds the following description when commenting on verse 8: “full of talk, but full of nonsense, boasting of themselves, prating spitefully against those that admonish them (3Jo 1:10), and pretending to give counsel and law to others. Of all fools, none more troublesome than the prating fools, nor that more expose themselves; but they shall fall into sin, into hell, because they received not commandments. Those that are full of tongue seldom look well to their feet, and therefore stumble and fall.”

In contrast, the wise person will open their ears instead of their mouth. Readily wanting to obey, he listens with great care instead of justifying his own actions or automatically believing he has a better way of doing things. The constantly running mouth, without a listening ear, are symptoms of pride, which “goeth before destruction, and an haughty spirit before a fall.” (Prov. 16:18)

In verse 8 we are contrasting the difference between a wise man and the “fool of lips.” But in the second use found in verse 10 we see contrasted the difference between “the winker” and “Mr. Loose Lips.” “He that winketh with the eye causeth sorrow: but a prating fool shall fall.”

Solomon, true to his wise nature, also addresses the lips of the wise in verses 11 and 13.

Proverbs 10:11 “The mouth of a righteous man is a well of life: but violence covereth the mouth of the wicked.” Instead of talking just to feel his gums flap or to enjoy the sound of his own voice, the righteous man is a well of life. Out of his mouth flows living water; he speaks the truth of righteousness and shares the way of salvation. His words give life, they are refreshing.

Proverbs 10:13 “In the lips of him that hath understanding wisdom is found: but a rod is for the back of him that is void of understanding.” Another pearl from Matthew Henry: “It is a man’s honour to have wisdom, but much more to be instrumental to make others wise.”

It’s fitting that we should examine ourselves, or perhaps I should suggest we look at our lips. Do our words more resemble Mr. Loose Lips/Sir Lip of Fools? Or are we Mr. Sweet Lips/ Sir Lips of Life?

Let’s close with Solomon’s encouragement from verse 12: “Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins.” The prating fool hates God in believing his way surpasses God’s; has no respect for himself or others; and constantly, even if unintentionally, stirs up strife. BUT Mr. Sweet Lips shares love, wisdom, and understanding; he’s a peacemaker and smoothes things out. Only God can turn a prating fool into a wise man who loves, is careful with his words, and shares truth for the benefit of others.



Set Your Sails Aright!

“And he arose, and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, Peace, be still. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.” Mark 4:39

After Jesus had been teaching all day by parables and sharing His doctrine with the multitudes who had gathered to listen, our Saviour directed His disciples to take their boat and “pass over unto the other side,” while He went below for a well-deserved nap. Suddenly there was a great storm; it was apparently not like any other storm these fishermen by trade had been in. For it caused them great fear. Jesus calmed the storm, questioned their lack of faith, and left them wondering about what they just witnessed and about the One who just performed this miracle before their very eyes.

Although terrible storms come up quickly on the Sea of Galilee, it’s likely that this was an act of spiritual warfare meant to keep Jesus from reaching His destination. After all, what took place when Jesus arrived on the shores of Gadara? He was met by a man with many, many unclean spirits, a soul which no man could control or tame. BUT JESUS! The same Son of God who calmed the storm upon the sea calmed the storm which described this man’s life and soul.

If you’ll take the time to read Mark 4:35 – 5:20, you’ll see a few things: Some lessons about our Lord; A man with a need to be freed (spiritual warfare); and, A Country Shown Cold to Christ.

There’s no question that the winds in our nation have been “winds of change.” A storm is brewing of epoch proportions – yes, something wicked this way comes. BUT JESUS! Take heart, even contrary winds can propel us forward if we set our sails aright. As these winds of change buffet and assail our ship, let us “keep looking unto Jesus, the Author and Finisher of our faith; let us come boldly before the throne of Grace for help in time of trouble. Yes, let us decidedly set our hearts upon God and His mercy and grace.

When the storms are raging, remember it was our Saviour that cried out, “Peace be still!” and all became instantly calm. Other times, the storms continue to rage but Jesus says, “Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.” (John 14:27) Such peace only comes by setting the sails of our mind aright, keeping our eyes, heart, and mind set on He who is the God of all peace.

Often, if we look deep enough, we will find that these storms (whether in our personal lives or in the life of our nation) are there for us to learn a lesson about ourselves (how’s your faith?); to see a greater need before us which requires spiritual warfare; to learn a lesson about our Lord; or to help us realize the true state of our nation. Regardless the storm, we need to call on the disciples as Jesus did, remain faithful, and look for opportunities to learn of Jesus and fight the good fight of faith – contend for the faith – and exhort others on to godliness. Set your sails aright, allow the storm to propel you forward toward Heaven’s shores.

I leave you with a poem written by Ella Wheeler Wilcox entitled The Winds of Fate.

One ship drives east and another drives west, With the selfsame winds that blow.

‘Tis the set of the sails, And not the gales

Which tells us the way to go. Like the winds of the sea are the ways of fate

As we voyage along through life: ‘Tis the set of a soul

That decided its goal, And not the calm or the strife.



Reesie's Recipes



Chocolate Dump Cake

- 1 box chocolate cake mix
- 1 (3.9 oz) box instant chocolate pudding mix
- 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ cups milk
- 1 cup mini chocolate chips
- 12oz jar hot fudge sauce, warmed
- 2 cups Cool Whip
- 1 cup crushed Oreos

Additional chocolate chips and crushed cookies for garnish

Preheat your oven to 350°F and grease a 9x13-inch baking dish. In a large bowl, whisk together the chocolate cake mix, chocolate pudding mix, and milk until smooth. Fold in the mini chocolate chips. Pour the batter into the prepared baking dish and spread it evenly. Bake for 30-35 minutes, or until a toothpick comes out clean. Let the cake cool completely in the dish. Poke holes all over the cake using the end of a wooden spoon. Pour the warm hot fudge sauce over the cake, making sure it soaks into the holes. Spread the Cool Whip evenly on top. Sprinkle with crushed Oreos and extra chocolate chips for a perfect finish. Chill in the fridge for at least 1 hour before serving.

No Bake Cookies

- 2 cups sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup evaporated milk
- 1 stick margarine
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup cocoa
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup peanut butter
- 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups 1 minute oats

In a large pan combined sugar, evaporated milk, margarine and cocoa. Over medium heat bring to a rolling boil. Boil for 1 minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat. Stir in peanut butter and oats. Spoon out onto buttered plates or parchment paper. For peanut butter no-bakes omit cocoa.

Taco Soup

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1 Onion, finely chopped
- 1 Packet Taco Bell Taco Seasoning Mix
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup water
- 1 Can Pinto Beans
- 1 Can chili Beans
- 1 Can whole kernel corn
- 1 Can mild Ro-Tel
- 1 Can petite Diced Tomatoes.
- 1 can chicken broth
- 1 Packet Ranch Dressing Mix.

Brown your meat with onion, drain. Return to skillet and add taco seasoning and $\frac{3}{4}$ cup water. Cook until most but not all of the water is dissolved. Add meat mixture to pan along with all of the canned ingredients. DO NOT drain any of the ingredients. Add ranch dressing mix. Stir well. Bring to a boil. Reduce to simmer and simmer for 45 minutes, stirring occasionally.



Wilt Thou Be Made Whole?

“When Jesus saw him lie, and knew that he had been now a long time in that case, he saith unto him, Wilt thou be made whole? The impotent man answered him, Sir, I have no man, when the water is troubled, to put me into the pool: but while I am coming, another steppeth down before me.”

John 5:6-7

The Apostle John tells us that at the pool of Bethesda a large group of people with many different ailments would spend their days waiting for the water to stir. An angel would stir the waters and the first one to step into the pool would be healed. This man that Jesus encountered had been at that pool due to his disability which he had for 38 years - he had been disabled longer than the Savior had been on earth. It's easy for us to picture - spending your time searching for any solution that could possibly make you whole, waiting for the world's advice to fill the void. We've all experienced it in some way, shape, or form.

Then one day, while the man was waiting, the cure he needed arrived. His healing wasn't going to come from the pool of Bethesda - it wasn't going to come through the “work of an angel”, but it was going to come through Jesus. As Jesus walks by, He understands the man's situation - He knows what this man has been through, and He offers a cure. “Wilt thou be made whole?” - Do you want to be healed? The man, still holding on to the only hope he's ever had, tells Jesus that he needs someone to put him in the water.

The problem we see here, and we experience ourselves, is placing our hope in the wrong place. The man was clinging to the pool of Bethesda, when Jesus was saying “just have faith, just trust me, and you will be healed”. Jesus wasn't asking if he had help, he wasn't asking if the man had tried to be healed - he was asking if the man had the faith to be healed. Do we have the faith to be changed by Christ, or do we want to keep holding to the “hope” that keeps failing us? In the case of this man, he had faith that Jesus would fix his situation and was made whole.

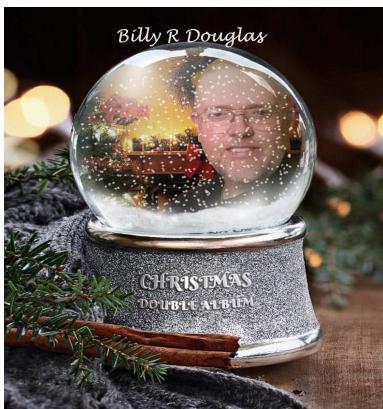

A Word for TODAY!

Verse for Today: Psalms 95:6 O come, let us worship and bow down: let us kneel before the LORD our maker.

Additional Passages for today: Ephesians 3:14 For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ; John 1:3 All things were made by him; and without him was not anything made that was made.; Revelation 22:17 And the Spirit and the bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely.

Thought for Today: Humility entices us to posture ourselves in the right position.

Story for Today: Brad lifted the guitar from the holder and wrapped the strap across his shoulder. Music was his life. He had been blessed to have a mom who played the piano and a dad who played drums when he was a child. They often let him bang and plunk the instruments as a toddler and he had his own guitar before his fifth birthday. Gifted as he was, he played specials at church by the time he was seven and was on the worship team before he turned ten. Brad had grown up in the church. His church was a good-sized church with close to 300 members. For a while, when he was a teen, they had two morning worship services and because the pastor wanted to cater to some of the more vocal members, the worship team was asked to play different songs for each service.

Cammi enjoyed singing on the worship team and loved music almost as much as Brad did. She was newer to the church having become a Christian in the last five years. Her desire to please the Lord and lead others into worship was obvious to everyone who met Cammi.

These two high schoolers were on fire for God and were so excited to share with their church the passion ignited at the youth retreat they had just attended. Psalm 95:6 had been the retreat's theme and learning about worship had been so amazing. Brad stepped up to the microphone and shared how God had spoken to him through the music during the first service as they sang hymns that he hadn't heard since his childhood. The message of the music brought him and about 600 others to the altar where they kneeled worshipping their God, their Lord and King. He told how, through the words he hadn't heard in several years, the power of God had come upon him and he found himself bowed at the altar, conviction heavy on his heart as he thought of the many times he had led worship in the church not mindful of the One they were supposed to be singing to. Cammi continued to share how she too had felt the Holy Spirit speaking to her soul. She was so grateful for the opportunity to kneel and worship, to bow her heart before her Lord her maker. His majesty, creativity, and splendor were overwhelming and the couple had tears running down their faces as they began to sing a more modern song from their places up front, but down on their knees. Others joined them as they too felt the presence of the Lord in that place. Brad explained that it truly wasn't a physical position that was necessary, although, for him, the physical position came naturally as his heart bowed in reverence to the One he loved with his whole being. Cammi too agreed and explained that tears weren't a requirement either, but sometimes one couldn't help as the flow of words and thought overwhelmed and her tears came. The couple encouraged those listening to follow what God directed them to do but, to do so in humility. Brad closed by sharing James 4:6 But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble.

Questions for Today: How is your heart? Do you humble yourself before the Lord? Do others see your humility or do you hide that from the eyes of those who might ridicule you?

Prayer for Today: Heavenly Father, Thank You for Your grace. Please help us to recognize true humility and how to know when we are falling away from it. Please guide those that are worship leaders and those that are led within the congregation. Please keep us from allowing pride to have its way in our lives and let Your grace fill us. Please help us to be able to position ourselves physically and spiritually in a way to honor You. This we pray in Jesus' Name, Amen.
