

“God Always Keeps His Word To Us”

Scripture Reference: Luke 2:22-32

And when the days of her purification according to the law of Moses were accomplished, they brought him to Jerusalem, to present him to the Lord; 23 (As it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that openeth the womb shall be called holy to the Lord;) 24 And to offer a sacrifice according to that which is said in the law of the Lord, A pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons. 25 And, behold, there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon; and the same man was just and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel: and the Holy Ghost was upon him. 26 And it was revealed unto him by the Holy Ghost, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Lord's Christ. 27 And he came by the Spirit into the temple: and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him after the custom of the law, 28 Then took he him up in his arms, and blessed God, and said, 29 Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word: 30 For mine eyes have seen thy salvation, 31 Which thou hast prepared before the face of all people; 32 A light to lighten the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel. We have a reason to rejoice! **WE CAN REJOICE IN A GOD WHO KEEPS HIS WORD!** We find someone that was characterized by expectation. His name was Simeon. And as we consider Simeon there are three aspects to the story that will give us reason to rejoice. The set up for the story goes like this...Luke 2:22 - And when the days of her purification according to the law of Moses were accomplished, they brought him to Jerusalem, to present him to the Lord; 23 (As it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that openeth the womb shall be called holy to the Lord;) 24 And to offer a sacrifice according to that which is said in the law of the Lord, A pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons. There are two reasons that Joseph and Mary come to Jerusalem. 1. The first reason was for purification. A woman who became pregnant and gave birth to a son was ceremonially unclean. As a rule, a woman had to be purified from her bleeding. By offering a sacrifice, she was permitted once again to enter into the sanctuary. 2. The second reason was to redeem the firstborn which according to the law belonged to God. Joseph and Mary came to do this which would have been five shekels. In today's terms this would be about \$7.50. This brings us to...**OUR STUDY:** I. The first aspect is **A REMARKABLE ANTICIPATION (25-26)**. 25 And, behold, there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon; and the same man was just and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel: and the Holy Ghost was upon him. 26 And it was revealed unto him by the Holy Ghost, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Lord's Christ. Simeon was a good man. He was devout. He was devoted to praying to God, reading God's Word and meditating on it. The text also emphasizes that this is a man of the Spirit. And the Spirit revealed to Him that he would see the Messiah. He was not going to die until the Messiah had come. We don't know when he found out, or how long he had been waiting. It could have been months, years or even decades...nevertheless, we are left with the impression that this is a patient man. He has been living in expectation. He has had a longing and a focus that has not given up. He has been anticipating the coming of the Messiah. This now brings us to...II. The second aspect is **A WONDERFUL ADORATION (27-28)**. 27 And he came by the Spirit into the temple: and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him after the custom of the law, 28 Then took he him up in his arms, and blessed God, and said, We don't know what Simeon was looking for in his own mind. Perhaps he was expecting a king to come out of the sky. Or perhaps he was expecting a warrior to release them from Rome. Though we don't know what he was expecting, we do know that when Joseph and Mary showed up with Jesus, he knew! All that he has longed for has finally come. The wait is over. Can you imagine what it must have been like for him? I can see him knowing and then moving quickly toward Mary and Joseph. I can see his eyes filled with tears. I see him with quivering hands and a trembling body. I see him taking the child from Mary and gazing at Him, blessing and worshipping God, and then giving this most magnificent acclamation. III. The third aspect is **A MAGNIFICENT ACCLAMATION (29-32)**. 29 Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word: 30 For mine eyes have seen thy salvation, 31 Which thou hast prepared before the face of all people; 32 A light to lighten the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel. As he holds Jesus, he knows salvation has come. This is the One! How can one know the future of one so new and small? But Simeon knows. This baby is the One through whom God would save His people. And here Simeon stands holding Jesus, standing in the gap between the covenant and the new. All the promises that have been made by God...everyone of them...are now being held in his arms. He is holding the promise. He is the salvation for all mankind...men, women and children. No one has to live in darkness anymore. Everyone can know the truth. Listen to some verses that declare that God is faithful to His promises. 1. Numbers 23:19 - God is not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do it? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good? 2. 1st Kings 8:56 - Blessed be the Lord, that hath given rest unto his people Israel, according to all that he promised: there hath not failed one word of all his good promise, which he promised by the hand of Moses his servant. 3. Joshua 21:45 - There failed not ought of any good thing which the Lord had spoken unto the house of Israel; all came to pass. 4. Joshua 23:14 - And, behold, this day I am going the way of all the earth: and ye know in all your hearts and in all your souls, that not one thing hath failed of all the good things which the Lord your God spake concerning you; all are come to pass unto you, and not one thing hath failed thereof. 5. 2nd Peter 3:9 - The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance. 6. Hebrews 10:23 - Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;); I love the old saying, "You can't break God's promises by leaning on them!" Lean On! God wants us to lean on his promises. He wants us to stand on them. And count on them. We have reason to rejoice! **WE HAVE A GOD WHO KEEPS HIS PROMISES.** And as you come humbly to Him, He will keep them to you as well. Because, just like Simeon, God does not want any of us to die before we have seen the Savior of the world or receive the promise He's made us.

REESIE'S RECIPES



Fruit Salad

- 1 can pineapple chunks, drain and save juice
- 1 can mandarin oranges, drain and save juice
- 1 can slice peaches, drain and save juice
- 1 jar maraschino cherries, drained and halved
- 4 bananas, sliced
- 1/2 to 1 pound white grapes
- 1 small box vanilla pudding

Combine pudding mix 2/3 cup pineapple juice and 1/3 cup mandarin orange juice in a sauce pan. Cook on medium heat until it turns into glaze. Pour over drained pineapple and oranges. Chill. Then add the rest of the fruit, mix well and serve.

Broccoli Corn Bread

- 2 boxes Jiffy corn muffin mix
- 10 oz. chopped broccoli
- 1 cup cottage cheese
- 4 eggs
- 1 1/2 sticks melted butter

Mix together in large mixing bowl and pour into a greased 9x13 dish. Bake at 350 for 35 minutes

Caramel Apple Cake


- 1 box Betty Crocker spice cake mix
- Water, Oil and Eggs called for on box
- 1 large apple, peeled and chopped
- 1 cup chopped pecans, toasted
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/4 cup butter
- 3 T. milk
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 cup powdered sugar

Heat oven to 350. Grease and flour bundt pan. Make cake as directed on box using water oil and eggs. Stir apple and 1/2 cup of pecans into batter. Pour into pan. Bake 45-50 minutes or until toothpick inserted comes out clean. Cool 10 minutes. Remove from pan to cooling rack. Cool completely. In a 2 quart sauce pan mix brown sugar, butter, and milk. Heat to boiling over medium heat. Stirring constantly with whisk. Boil 1 minute. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla. Gradually stir in powdered sugar until smooth. Stir gently 2 to 3 minutes or until slightly thickened. Immediately spoon glaze over top of cake allowing some to drizzle down sides. Top with remaining 1/2 cup of pecans.

Whipping Cream Biscuits

- 1 1/2 cups self rising flour
- 1/2 pint whipping cream

Mix flour and cream only until well blended. Butter hands well and form dough into ping pong size balls or smaller. Place on baking sheet 1 inch apart. Bake at 425 for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown.

A Renewed Mind

"And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness. Wherefore putting away lying, speak every man truth with his neighbour: for we are members one of another."

Ephesians 4:24,25 (KJV)

To be renewed in your mind is not speaking about going back to what was "in you" naturally; (having been "created in the image of God") for while our first parent were created in a state of innocence, they succumb to the temptations of the enemy, and in consequence of their fall - all men have become depraved, and justly exposed to God's wrath. If ever we needed to be "renewed" from the presence of sin and death - it is from our natural birth. But get this... to be renewed in your mind is something that is "infused" with that which was never there before. That word "infused" implies a pouring in of something that gives new life or significance); and because it is "new in all its parts"; those who have it, have new hearts and new spirits given unto them. Isn't that amazing. That "wave" of people who desire to live in the "Spiritual Realm" (because of that movie as well as a television show that all the young people are watching today - "Twilight") they ought to try Jesus. Think of it. What we're talking about is something that is done spiritually, yet while you have the same eyes, you see as if you have never seen before. While you have the same ears, the old jokes, and conversations "sting" with outrage where they never did before. While you have the same hands - you treat all that you come in contact with as "holy" for they are the extension of God Himself. While you have the same feet, they have found new paths to walk, and have caused you now to walk in the light, rather than in darkness. To "put on" this new man, is not to "make ourselves" new creatures. Understand here and now - that this work can be done by God alone. This is not the power of man, but the Spirit of God; it is God's work, not man's. It is He who made us at first, "remaking us", not because He was imperfect - but because we are imperfect. Therefore in our imperfection we "could not" remake ourselves. We needed a sacrifice that would be everlasting. Hallelujah! His name is Jesus - and He has not only come - but He has "completed the work" at Calvary. There is one further comment that I wish to make with regard to this very important "renewal" of man. While it is God that effects the work in our lives - Paul is very clear here that there must first be a "putting away" of the Old Man. While God can and "does effect" the change in our lives - it is only by our "conscious choice" that we allow Him to do so. The Spirit of God is a gentleman, and He will not impart Himself upon an individual until He has been invited. Then, when He has "infused us" with His power to "put away" evil speaking, and to "put away" lies, and to "put away all manner of false speaking with one another...", He then gives us the power through the reading of The Word, being "strengthened on the inner man" (the center of the mind) to "put on" new conversations, and new attitudes, and to perceive the effectual work of grace upon the soul; walking according to the principles of that grace and holiness formed there. O Friend. Do you want that kind of renewal in your life this morning? Are you tired of waking up and saying "good Lord...it's morning" - when you could be saying, "Good Morning Lord - what do you have for me today?" One way is lonely an miserable and at best, full of darkness - while His way is to feel "fresh", and new - "ALIVE"! Amazing Grace

What it means to live under grace is illustrated by the life of John Newton. Newton was born in London, half a century before the American Revolution, to a mother of superb spiritual qualities and a nondescript father. His mother died when he was six. Five years later he went to sea with his father who was a ship's captain. He became a midshipman and for a time led a wild existence, living in utter disgrace. He rejected the God of his mother, he renounced any need of religion and he lived an irresponsible and sinful life. Eventually he became a slave trader, crossing the ocean several times as captain of slave ship, responsible for terrible human degradation among the captives he had crowded on board. But grace was always a factor in his life. He survived a deadly fever in Africa, and his ship survived a terrible storm which almost killed him. Finally, dissatisfied with his life, he began reading the writings of Thomas a Kempis. Somehow, the Holy Spirit began stirring inside his soul, awakening him from sin, urging him toward salvation until he finally gave his heart to Christ. He was so thoroughly converted, in fact, that he felt a call from God to enter the ministry. He was eventually ordained in 1781 and accepted a pastorate in Olney, England. But Newton's disgraceful past never left his memory and he was completely dumbfounded over the privilege of living joyously free under the divine grace of God. In an intense moment of inspiration, when he was thinking of the wonder of the grace of God which had saved even a wretch like him, he wrote the hymn, "Amazing grace, how sweet the sound."

Is Your Heart Stirred?

Acts 17:16 "... his spirit was stirred in him, when he saw the city wholly given to idolatry."

When is the last time that your spirit was stirred on behalf of God? Many times a person's spirit may get stirred at a sporting event, a political rally, or when they feel they've been personally wronged; but, when is the last time your spirit was stirred because God was wronged? Does it stir your spirit that thousands of babies are murdered every day in this nation at the altar of self? Does it stir your heart that many are killed, brought into bondage, abused, and homes ruined as men and women bow to the altar of alcohol? Does your heart break over the children and women who are made to be slaves at the altar of human trafficking in this country? Is your heart stirred over the redefinition of marriage as the idol of homosexuality is lifted up and we fly in the face of God? Is your heart stirred at the fact that we deny God as Creator, oppress the poor, rob God, blaspheme His holy name, call good evil and evil good, and do all manner of evil as we worship at the idol of self? (Here are some good examples of a stirred spirit: Psalm 119:136; 2 Peter 2:8) Too often you sit in apathy and your heart is not stirred unless something affects you personally. If you've been personally wronged; that might put a burr under your saddle; but otherwise, you're content to sit back and watch the world go by. Oh may God stir your heart! Sometimes you are upset about the things that are going on around you but your spirit isn't stirred. A stirred spirit makes waves my friend. A spirit that's stirred must speak out; it's like a burning in your soul and the fire of truth must escape or you'll be burned up. Paul's spirit was stirred and there is only one solution for a stirred spirit—speak the truth! Paul did not go around chopping at all the different fruit or speaking against each individual idol. He went straight to the root of the trouble. They needed Jesus; they needed to repent! Paul pointed out that God IS the Creator, He will not wink at sin and ALL men EVERYWHERE need to repent. He pointed to Jesus as the answer for their trouble. Paul was preaching to a very religious lot. Jesus preached to a very religious lot. It's time for the church to hear the truth, stand for the truth and preach the truth. You, my fellow believers, ARE the Church. My spirit is stirred over the fact that Christians give more credence to their feelings and opinions than they do the true and holy word of God. I tire of men's opinions. I especially tire when a "Christian" gives man's opinion without responding according to God's word. AND I particularly get tired of it when they argue against God's word without using any scripture to back it up. It's about their FEELING. FEELINGS mislead where God's word leads. If I FEEL it's ok to commit murder because there's a peace in my heart about it...may I...NO! GOD FORBID!! God's word is for all men and all situations regardless of how I feel about it. If your spirit is stirred and you speak up in the church you can be assured of getting the same response as Paul. Most will mock you, some will be interested and there will only be a few who will believe and follow the truth. Your job is to allow the Holy Spirit to use you. He's the One who stirred your spirit. Speak the truth and allow Him to convict where conviction is necessary. We can only plant and water the seed. It is only God who brings the increase. Press on in the truth! Press on in the Spirit!
