Take all that hinders this desire, And set my spirit free.

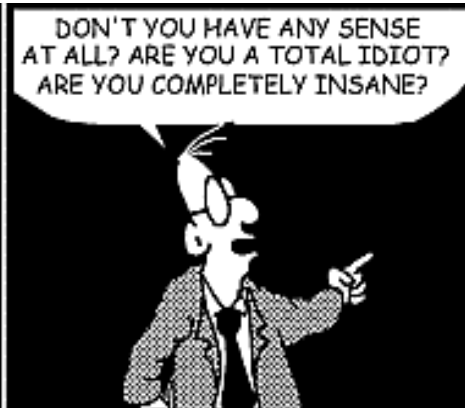
There is no joy like knowing You, I'm waiting at your feet.

"The Board Meeting had come to an end. Bob started to stand up and jostled the table, spilling his coffee over his notes. "How embarrassing. I am getting so clumsy in my old age." Everyone had a good laugh, and soon they were all telling stories of their most embarrassing moments. It came around to Frank who sat quietly listening to the others. Someone said, "Come on, Frank. Tell us your most embarrassing moment." Frank laughed and began to tell of his childhood. "I grew up in San Pedro. My Dad was a fisherman, and he loved the sea. He had his own boat, but it was hard making a living on the sea. He worked hard and would stay out until he caught enough to feed the family. Not just enough for our family, but also for his Mom and Dad and the other kids that were still at home." He looked around and said, "I wish you could have met my Dad. He was a big man, and he was strong from pulling the nets and fighting the seas for his catch. When you got close to him, he smelled like the ocean. He would wear his old canvas, foul-weather coat and his bibbed overalls. His rain hat would be pulled down over his brow. No matter how much my Mother washed them, they would still smell of the sea and of fish." Frank's voice dropped a bit. "When the weather was bad he would drive me to school. He had this old truck that he used in his fishing business. That truck was older than he was. It would wheeze and rattle down the road. You could hear it coming for blocks. As he would drive toward the school, I would shrink down into the seat hoping to disappear. Half the time, he would slam to a stop and the old truck would belch a cloud of smoke. He would pull right up in front, and it seemed like everybody would be standing around and watching. Then he would lean over and give me a big kiss on the cheek and tell me to be a good boy. It was so embarrassing for me. Here, I was twelve years old, and my Dad would lean over and kiss me goodbye!" He paused and then went on, "I remember the day I decided I was too old for a goodbye kiss. When we got to the school and came to a stop, he had his usual big smile. He started to lean toward me, but I put my hand up and said, 'No, Dad.' It was the first time I had ever talked to him that way, and he had this surprised look on his face." I said, "Dad, I'm too old for a goodbye kiss. I'm too old for any kind of kiss." "My Dad looked at me for the longest time, and his eyes started to tear up. I had never seen him cry. What The Bible Says Homosexuality And The LGBTQ Lifestyle *conclusion*

Gilbert Baker, an artist and drag queen, first created the Rainbow Flag in 1978. Baker's rainbow flag actually originally had eight colors – hot pink, red, orange, yellow, green, turquoise, indigo/blue and violet — but it gradually lost its stripes until it became the six-color version most commonly used today. Each of the colors has its own significance, he says: hot pink for sex, red for life, orange for healing, yellow for sunlight, green for nature, turquoise for art, indigo for harmony and violet for spirit. The flag lost its hot pink stripe when Baker approached the Paramount Flag Company to begin mass producing them – the hot pink fabric was too rare and expensive to include. The flag lost its indigo stripe before the 1979 Gay Freedom Day Parade. The committee organizing the parade wanted to split the flag in half and fly each part from the light poles along both sides of Market Street, so it became a six-striped flag. Baker says the flag was cemented as an international symbol in 1994, when he made a mile-long flag for the 25th anniversary of the Stonewall riots. About that Pride thing...As a Bible believer, I always found it odd that the LGBT would call their movement the Pride movement. The Bible says that all the 'children of pride' have a king set over them to rule them, and that king is the Devil who shows up as Leviathan in the book of Job 41:34 - "He be- holdeth all high things: he is a king over all the children of pride." And, oh yeah, that's the sixth place where the word 'pride' appears in the Bible. Homosexuality In The New Testament People very passionately debate over the two passages we have mentioned from Genesis, saying that neither passage is a direct indictment against homo- sexuality, only against violent behavior. So, let's go to the New Testament from our main text in Romans 1:26-27 to see how God is dealing with the topic there. "For this cause God gave them up unto vile affections: for even their women did change the natural use into that which is against nature: And likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust one toward another; men with men working that which is unseemly, and re- ceiving in themselves that recompence of their error which was meet." Here we see in Romans the acts of both male and female homosexuality mentioned. The Holy Spirit, writing though the Apostle Paul, minces no words about the topic. God here labels homosexual activity with the term 'vile affections' and says that the practice is 'against nature' and unnatural. Nowhere in the entire bible is homosexual activity ever mentioned in a good or positive way. Not even once. It is always connected with a curse, sin, judgment or destruction. The bible offers no stories of happy homosexual unions or gay "marriages". In point of fact, gay marriage doesn't even exist. Like the rainbow, it's just another thing stolen from the Bible and appropriated for their own ends. Marriage in the bible, which was or- dained by God, is always between a man and a woman. All love is not love. So you have a choice. You can agree with what God has written in the bible, or you can rebel against it and claim any one of a number of reasons why what is in the bible doesn't apply to you. But understand one thing. Whether or not homosexuality is a choice is be- side the point. God says that it is a sin that needs to be repented of. The bible does not say that people were cre- ated as homosexual any more than it says that people were created to do any other sin of any kind. The "I was born this way" argument receives no support in the pages of scripture. God created a man and woman, and He gave them the gift of sexuality. Homosexuality appears exactly 6 chapters after the fall of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, but it does not happen in the time in which God says that things were perfect and right. Homosexuality shows up after sin had entered into the world, and the world itself had been cursed. Christianity cannot be reconciled with homosexuality any more than it can be with drunkenness, murder, fornication or gossip. You cannot have both as they are opposed to each other. You must choose. I pray that God will open your eyes to this lifestyle that is not of God!

The Crimson Wave

One of my favorite time periods to read about is the Scottish Covenanters and their heroic struggle for civil freedom and religious liberty. Although theirs was a different day, the struggles remain the same, as they always have throughout time. An English poetess by the name of Mary Howitt captured well and succinctly the times, their trouble, and their faithfulness to the Lord Jesus, the King of kings:

“Land of the Bruce and Wallace, Where patriot hearts have stood. And for their country and their cause Like water poured their blood: Where wives and little children Were faithful to the death. And graves of martyred warriors Are in the desert heath.”

No, I don't have a romanticized view of those days. The terror, bloodshed, and stories that sound like they are taken from the end of Hebrews chapter eleven are heart-rending. These same stories, the “sermons” preached on a hangman's scaffold, last words spoken with final gasps of breath from faithful women and children as the tide takes them to a watery grave, and accounts of virtue and bravery, all for the sake of Jesus, are heart-warming and encouraging. In them we read of Christian valor, virtue, and strength of character that only comes from devotion to our Sovereign, Jesus. The land and laws that surrounded these covenanters were merciless for the sake of the king; but, they lived in the everlasting mercy of their King. Plunged beneath the crimson wave of Christ's saving blood, they were able to stand faithfully against the crimson wave of persecution. The latter would stain their clothes crimson with their own blood while the crimson wave of Christ would clothe them in garments of pure white. Why do I share all this with you? For two reasons: 1) The land and laws in which many Christians around the world now live are also merciless in regards to Christianity. The crimson wave of persecution assaults these contemporary brothers and sisters in Christ; we need to be lifting them up in prayer and encouraging them by any means available to us. Having shared often about the things we can do, I'll only share these two websites where one can find ways to pray, inform others, and write letters of encouragement to these modern day “covenanters.” www.opendoorsusa.org and www.persecution.com (Voice of the Martyrs) 2) Unless God does a mighty work of revival within our own country, we are likely to find ourselves in the midst of a crimson tsunami ourselves. We must not consider it a strange thing (1 Peter 4:12); rather, we must prepare for such attacks as the covenanters of old did. How's that? By following the Bible's instruction for true Christian living, being rooted and built up in Christ, with devotion to Him; this prepares us to stand with utter abandon for His sake. Are you ready to stand? In order to answer that question let's ask ourselves another; am I standing now? Am I currently taking stands on Biblical truth when it runs contrary to the cultural norm? Have I purposed in my heart not to defile myself with the portion of the king's meat (Daniel 1:8)? In other words, do I stand for truth regardless of how it may affect me financially, in popularity with my friends or family, at work, at church, or in my community? Have I unflinchingly committed myself and my family to seeking holiness without which no man shall see the Lord and given myself to faithful service? In all these things do I stand with the compassion and love of Jesus? The Crimson Sunrise Is Dawning How can some blindly fool themselves into thinking that they can live for Jesus and escape such a fiery trial? Reading Donald Cargill's description of the 1680 Scottish government should make us take heed rather than apathetically let our guard down when we recognize both the similarities between then and now, and the way Cargill's government ruthlessly hunted him and other covenanters down. His call for rebellion was more a call to stand for Christ than it was an incitement to civil disobedience. “...now it cannot be called a government, but a lustful rage, exercised with as little right reason, and more cruelty than beasts; and they themselves can no more be called governors, but public grassators (bully, hoodlum, criminal), and public judgements, which all ought to set themselves against, as they would do against pestilence, sword and famine raging among them.” Listening to the Left for the last decade, and even the recent Democrat Presidential debates, should leave no room for doubt that the crimson sunrise has more than peeked over the horizon. We must count the cost. Scottish historian A. B. Todd describes that era of persecution with these words. “It is not, however, as great military geniuses that the Covenanters stand out so conspicuously and so honourably in history; but for lofty courage, unselfish zeal, un murmuring endurance, fervent piety, and unwavering faith in the Most High, and in the ultimate triumph of the principles for which they labored, suffered, and died, they have rarely been equaled, and have never been surpassed by men of any nation or time. When their little armies had been broken and dispersed by the larger hosts and the unsparing sword of the oppressor, rather than violate their consciences by yielding, they betook themselves for shelter and security to the dreary deserts, and to ‘the dens and caves of the earth;’ and there, for long years, amid tempest and gloom, smitten by hunger, hacked by the sword, hunted like wild beasts of prey, and shot at like the ptarmigan of the hills, they, without a grudge—‘Laid down their lives in the moorlands away, And bled for their God and Forgiver.’” The writer of Hebrews describes them and many others from foreign lands in our day this way, “Of whom the world was not worthy.” (Hebrews 11:38). Will/are you and I worthy of the world or are our lives in Christ worthy of heaven? How then must we stand?

Oreo Cake

- 1 box triple chocolate cake mix
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 1 box unprepared chocolate pudding
- 1 cup sour cream
- 4 eggs
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 6 Oreos finely crumbled

Frosting

- 1 package cream cheese softened
- 4 cups powdered sugar
- 1 tbsp vanilla
- 1 container Cool Whip

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix together the cake mix, oil, pudding, sour cream, eggs, and water. Then add in chocolate chips and finely chopped Oreos. Bake in 2 9" round cake pans for 25 to 30 minutes or until toothpick inserted in middle comes out clean. While the cake cools, make the frosting. Beat the cream cheese and vanilla together until smooth and fluffy. Slowly add in the sugar while continuing to mix the cream cheese mixture. On a low speed, add in the cool whip. You may need to allow the frosting to set up in the refrigerator. Make sure the cake is completely cool before adding frosting. Frost first layer then top with second layer. Continue frosting top and sides of cake.

Red Cactus Chili

- 1 lb ground beef
- 1 jar Red Cactus salsa
- 1 can stewed tomatoes
- 1 small can tomato sauce
- 2 cans chili beans
- 1/4 cup ketchup
- 1/2 packet McCormick chili seasoning

Cook ground beef until done, drain off excess grease. Put all ingredients in large pot and simmer for 30 to 60 minutes.

Taco Spaghetti Casserole

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 (1.25-ounce) package taco seasoning
- 1 (10-ounce can) Rotel Mild Diced Tomatoes & Green Chilies
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 8 ounces spaghetti
- 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/2 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1 Roma tomato, diced
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro leaves

Heat olive oil in a large stockpot or Dutch oven over medium high heat. Add ground beef and cook until beef has browned, about 3-5 minutes, making sure to crumble the beef as it cooks; stir in taco seasoning. Drain excess fat. Stir in Rotel, tomato paste, spaghetti and 3 cups water. Bring to a boil; cover, reduce heat and simmer until pasta is cooked through, about 13-16 minutes. Remove from heat and top with cheeses.

Cover until melted, about 2 minutes. Serve immediately, garnished with tomato and cilantro, if desired.

Dr. Pepper Jello Salad

- 20 ounce crushed pineapple
- 1/2 cup water
- 2- 3 ounce pkgs cherry gelatin
- 20 ounce Cherry Pie Filling
- 3/4 cup Diet Cherry Dr Pepper

Drain pineapple, reserving the juice. Set aside. In a saucepan, bring pineapple juice and water to a boil. Add gelatin and stir until dissolved. Stir in diet dr pepper. Stir in Cherry pie filling. Stir in pineapple. Pour into mold or serving bowl. Refrigerate until firm. Serve cold.

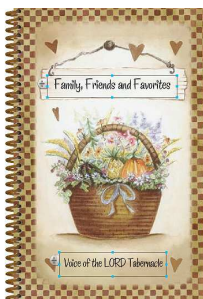
Keep Your Nose To The Grindstone!

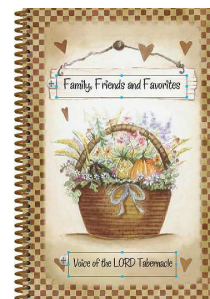

A Word for TODAY!

Additional passage for Today: Colossians 1:9-12; James 1:5-7

Thought for Today: We've only one life to live for Christ. What you do, and how you live and love will make a difference. Eternity is being determined for yourself and others.

Story for Today Eternal life. The words somehow brought peace to Abdul's Muslim heart, and made him curious enough to accept a Bible. Did you know that giving a bible could change the eternal destiny of people like Abdul? Abdul like many of the Muslims in his Sharia compliant village had been taught to hate the Christian that he was now finding so fascinating. He flipped through the pages of his new Bible to find the words that filled him not only with peace but a longing that he couldn't shake. "Romans 5:21 That as sin hath reigned unto death, even so might grace reign through righteousness unto eternal life by Jesus Christ our Lord." Abdul was a well educated student. He followed the rules of his religion; that is he used to follow them all. Today, as he sat reading, studying words like eternal life, grace and righteousness he broke the rules as his heart embraced the sought after peace that was as foreign to him as the white missionary that had given him the Bible. Matt had not tried to force a new religion down his throat. But something about him and the way he treated all people with respect was awe inspiring. Abdul had watched as Matt seemed to continuously live out his beliefs by helping the widows and orphans and being kind to everyone, regardless if they were male or female. Today, Abdul had witnessed Matt take a beating that was intended for a women. Abdul often saw men, beat the women into submission. Something inside of him had burst open when he saw Matt throw himself over the women and take her punishment. Abdul wanted to find out why Matt was so different. He wanted to meet the man that Matt talked about; the man that Matt claimed was the reason he was so different. He focused on his reading and was amazed at how these new concepts brought such hope to his heart. He remembered that Matt said he could talk to this God. That he could ask him questions and for help in understanding. He bowed his head as he had seen Matt do, and began to talk to the Creator.

Questions for Today: What are you showing of Christ today? Are you giving hope through a changed life? Are you sharing God's word with others?

For this cause we also, since the day we heard it, do not cease to pray for you, and to desire that ye might be filled with the knowledge of his will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God; Strengthened with all might, according to his glorious power, unto all patience and longsuffering with joyfulness; Giving thanks unto the Father, which hath made us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light: Colossians 1:9-12

If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord. James 1:5-7

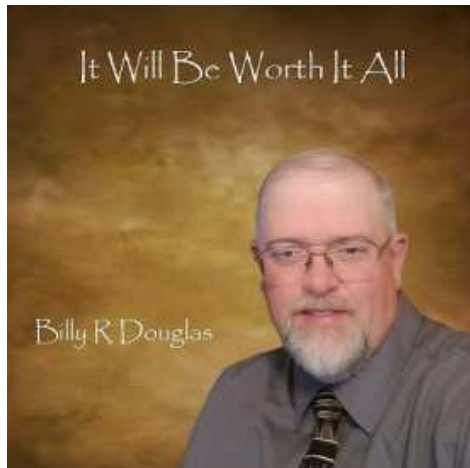
