And ye shall know that I am in the midst of Israel, and that I am the LORD your God, and none else: and my people shall never be ashamed. The Lord Will Pour Out His Spirit And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions: And also upon the servants and upon the handmaids in those days will I pour out my spirit. And I will shew wonders in the heavens and in the earth, blood, and fire, and pillars of smoke. The sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before the great and the terrible day of the LORD come. And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the LORD shall be delivered: for in mount Zion and in Jerusalem shall be deliverance, as the LORD hath said, and in the remnant whom the LORD shall call. Joel 2:21-32

Money can be restored. Property can be restored—broken-down cars, stripped painting, old houses. Relationships can be restored. But one thing that can never be restored is time. Time flies and it does not return. Years pass and we never get them back. Yet God promises the impossible: "I will restore the years that the locust has eaten" (Joel 2:25). The immediate meaning of this promise is clear. God's people had suffered the complete destruction of their entire harvest through swarms of locusts that marched like an insect army through the fields, destroying the crops, multiplying their number as they went. For four consecutive years, the harvest was completely wiped out. God's people were brought to their knees in more ways than one.

Joel 2:18-19 - Then will the Lord be jealous for his land, and pity his people. 19 Yea, the Lord will answer and say unto his people, Behold, I will send you corn, and wine, and oil, and ye shall be satisfied therewith: and I will no more make you a reproach among the heathen. In the coming years, God said in Joel 2:24-26 - And the floors shall be full of wheat, and the vats shall overflow with wine and oil 25 And I will restore to you the years that the locust hath eaten, the cankerworm, and the caterpiller, and the palmerworm, my great army which I sent among you. 26 And ye shall eat in plenty, and be satisfied, and praise the name of the Lord your God, that hath dealt wondrously with you: and my people shall never be ashamed. This wonderful promise for those people meant that years of abundant harvests would follow the years of desolation brought about by the locusts.

But God has also put this promise in the Bible for us today. Lost Years of Our Lives What do "lost years" look like for us? Lost years (or locust years) are years that you can't get back, and they come in many varieties. 1. Lost years are fruitless years. A lot of hard work was done in the years the locusts had eaten. After everything was destroyed, the people must have thought, All this work and what do I have to show for it? Some of you know this pain in the world of business—a failed venture, a bad investment, a misguided policy, and all the effort that you put in day-by-day, month-by-month, year-by-year led only to massive disappointment. You think, What has come of all my time and all my effort? 2. Lost years are painful years. I'm thinking of those who have lost a loved one. You had plans for the future, but now you fear the coming years may be empty. I'm thinking also of those who live with illness in the body or the mind. You assumed that you would always be able to do what you used to do. You have to find a way to live with the disappointment that you cannot.



Syncretism: Assault on all that is holy

Psalm 12 assures us that "The words of the LORD are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times." It's vital that we whole-heartedly accept and adhere to the whole counsel of God in its pure, unadulterated form. Syncretism assaults the Word of God, the Christian faith, the Church whose sacred Head is Jesus, and, indirectly, our nation which was founded upon the principles of Biblical Christianity. It's an assault on our soul and upon on the souls of our children. It's vital that you understand this war which is being waged and what you can do to protect yourself and those you love.

Syncretism could best be described as spiritual or theological "hash." Most of the older folks who are reading this will recognize hash as being a dish of chopped meat, potatoes, and sometimes vegetables that have been fried together. They may also "fondly" recall that any leftovers might become a main ingredient. I remember hearing one old Baptist preacher jokingly proclaim that many folks didn't like hash because they didn't know what was in it and others refused to eat it because they did know.

Some of the ingredients in this spiritual hash would include Christianity, paganism, secularism, and humanism, often heated by one's emotions, likes, and lusts. In other words, syncretism is a conglomeration of various beliefs where one has created a hybrid god viewed as more appealing than the one, true God of the Bible. We will get a better understanding of why this is so important for us to recognize as we look at some numbers from George Barna and reflect on God's words through the prophet Jeremiah: "...consider diligently, and see if there be such a thing. Hath a nation changed their gods, which are yet no gods? but my people have changed their glory for that which doth not profit. Be astonished, O ye heavens, at this, and be horribly afraid...For my people have committed two evils; they have forsaken me the fountain of living waters, and hewed them out cisterns, broken cisterns, that can hold no water." (2:10-13)

Some of you may be familiar with syncretism as it relates to Chrislam (the melding together of Christianity and Islam); the syncretism of Wicca with Christianity – like "Christian witches" and "Christian tarot cards;" as well as the syncretism of Christianity and communism which has steadily been taking place in China at the behest of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP). What you may not be aware of is the overwhelming speed and breadth at which this spiritual "hash" is being flung into American churches and homes.

It's vital that we understand how this issue is affecting our nation and, in particular, our children. We must seriously evaluate the churches we are attending and compare our pastor's preaching with the whole counsel of God, otherwise we could possibly be putting ourselves in grave danger. As one online source stated, "Perhaps our greatest concern shouldn't be empty pulpits, but rather empty pastors standing in them."

The Christian Post reports on a recent Barna survey, stating, "The nationwide study of about 1,000 Christian pastors found that just slightly more than a third (37%) of the U.S. pastors hold a biblical worldview. The majority (62%) possess a hybrid worldview known as Syncretism." They also quote George Barna as saying, "From a worldview perspective, a church's most important ministers are the children's pastor and the youth pastor. Discovering that seven out of every eight of those pastors lack a biblical worldview helps to explain why so few people in the nation's youngest generations are developing a heart and mind for biblical principles and ways of life, and why our society seems to have run wild over the last decade, in particular." With all this, it's easy to understand why Jesus would ask, "When the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?"

What can we do to battle this corrosive doctrine of demons called syncretism? Faithfully attend a Bible believing church where application is strong and relevant. Live out a life of personal holiness and speak the truth in love, addressing the church, the culture, and our children. Finally, take to heart this admonition by J.C. Ryle: "Walk more closely with God. Get nearer to Christ. Seek to exchange hope for assurance. Seek to feel the witness of the Spirit more closely and distinctly every year. Lay aside every weight, and the sin that so easily threatens you. Press towards the mark more earnestly. Fight a better fight, and war a better warfare every year you live. Pray more. Read more. Subdue self more. Love the brethren more. Oh that you may endeavor to grow in grace every year, that the end of your Christian course may be better than the beginning!"



Stuffed Mushrooms

2 lbs fresh mushrooms
2 Tbsp butter
1/3 cup onion, diced
1/2 lb sausage
1 small box frozen spinach

1/2 lb Monterey jack cheese, grated

Clean mushrooms, cutting off stems. Dice 1/2 cup mushroom stems. Saute onion and mushroom stems in butter. Cook sausage and drain. In saucepan cook spinach, drain. Mix sauteed onions, mushroom stems, sausage, spinach and cheese. Stuff mushrooms. Place in shallow greased pan. Bake at 350 for 15 minutes.

Sausage & Stuffing Appetizers

1/4 cup butter1/2 cup water1 box stove top stuffing for pork

1 egg 1/4 lb sausage

1 lb bacon

Melt butter with water. Stir in stuffing mix, add egg and sausage. Blend with hands. Chill for one hour or so. Shape into balls. Cut bacon into thirds. Wrap around balls and insert toothpick. Cook at 375 for 35 minutes.

White Chocolate Strawberry Pie

CRUST

1 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs1 stick butter, meltedDash of salt

FILLING

12 oz cream cheese, softened
2 cups powdered sugar
1/2 cup white chocolate chips
1 1/2 Tbsp fresh squeezed orange juice
2 cups cool whip
Dash of salt

TOPPING

1 lb strawberries, sliced3 Tbsp white chocolate chips

Crush graham crackers. Pour melted butter over crumbs. Pour evenly into pie dish, press along bottom and sides. Pour 1/2 cup white chocolate chips into a small bowl. Melt, stirring every 30 seconds. Set aside to cool a bit. In large mixing bowl beat cream cheese until smooth. Add powdered sugar, mix well. Add cool whip, orange juice, melted chips and salt. Mix well. Mixture should be creamy and smooth. Spoon filling over crust. Wash and slice strawberries. Layer on top of filling. Melt additional white chocolate chips for topping. Drizzle over strawberries. Chill for 1 hour.

No Peek Steak Tips

2 lbs stew meat
1 can cream of mushroom soup
1 packet brown gravy
1 envelope beefy onion soup mix
1 can of water.

Place the meat in a 13x9 pan. Mix together the other ingredients in a bowl. Pour over the meat. Cover with foil. Bake at 300 for 3 hours. No peeking! Serve with mashed potatoes or noodles.

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The Message Of The Cross

Some may wonder why when I preach or mention Jesus I usually and the phrase "and Him crucified." Or why I use the phrase "Message of the Cross" instead of simply saying the "Gospel." I will explain by first saying that the Gospel and the Message of the Cross are synonyms. They refer to the same thing. The issue is that in our day and age I feel we have to further clarify which "Gospel" we are preaching. You see, there are so many preaching a false Gospel these days, that it is necessary to define which Gospel I preach. So I clarify it by saying "the Jesus of Scripture" or "Jesus Christ and Him Crucified."

There are many preaching a false Jesus... either adding things to or removing something from the Plan of Salvation. Sometimes this is done in ignorance, sometimes in malice, and often in pride. There are many false gospels being taught. So many in fact, that to simply say the word "Gospel" many times means different things to different people. But when I say "The message of the Cross," "The Jesus of Scripture," and "Jesus Christ, and Him Crucified," I am further defining the Gospel I am preaching.

See, the Virgin Birth, the Healing Ministry of Jesus, What He accomplished at Calvary, His Resurrection, the Baptism in the Holy Spirit... these and many more biblical concepts are defined and given relevance by the Message of the Cross. my Faith in this Biblical Jesus and what He accomplished at Calvary gives me not only cleansing from the penalty of my sin, but also progressively sanctifies me and grants me victory over sin in my life, as I become more like Him and less like me. I am not ashamed of the Jesus Christ of Scripture! The world has little problem with the vague mention of God, or the preaching of an incomplete Jesus who did some good deeds. But when you say I serve Jesus Christ, the Crucified One, the Lion of the Tribe of Judah, the Root of David, the Bright and Morning Star...

That One who was WORTHY to open the Book and loose the seals...The One who scourged the temple with a whip He braided Himself...The Jesus whose Fan is in His Hand...The Rose of Sharon and the Lily of the Valley...The Alpha and Omega... My advocate with the Father...Whose blood has bought me, freed me from sin... The world will hate you for preaching this Jesus. But I must tell them about Him. I am compelled by His love. The Blood of this Jesus, this Crucified One, is still the only thing that has ever given man victory over sin, That is why I preach this message, because it is truth.

Verse for Today: Proverbs 23:4 Labour not to be rich: cease from thine own wisdom.

Additional passages for Today: 1Timothy 6:9-10; James 1:9-12; Col 3:1 & 2

Thought for Today: God wants us to focus on eternal things, things that can't be bought with money or other material possessions. Labour for the kingdom, not for selfish riches.

Story for Today: Levi had some tough decisions to make, and soon. The pressure to decide what he would do with his future as he chose a college was nothing compared to the overwhelming choices he faced as he struggled to decide what he would major in and the courses needed. He had been looking at many different recommendations about what this college had to offer and when they recommended the classes be taken. He also had spoken to several men in his life, asking them for guidance. His Dad was a quiet man that really didn't want to sway his son one way or the other and left the decision up to him. Several of his teachers were more than willing to encourage him to focus on a specific field. He even had one man try to convince him that he should only focus on the fields that had the most potential for financial success. Levi was still unsettled as he thought about a lifetime of work and what he should do. He was grateful that most of his classes this first year were basic classes and were required prerequisites for all of the fields he was considering. Levi and his roommate Jim headed out the door to attend the campus worship night. It was his one hour that he could relax and just enjoy singing praises to God. As the group gathered, a slim, somewhat tall man stepped forward to the microphone. He thanked everyone for joining them and shared his life verse. Labour not to be rich: cease from thine own wisdom. Proverbs 23:4. Sharing about a time in his life, Mr. Rich, explained that he had once been a plastic surgeon. The money was good. The benefits were awesome and he was able to do and buy almost anything that he wanted. He had every reason to be happy with his life. He was a decent guy. He often attended church and gave regularly to charities. But the lack of peace was so strong that he never could fully enjoy all the entertainment that filled his days. Loneliness and desperation caused him many sleepless nights. Seeking to find contentment, Mr. Rich explained that he registered for a conference for men where he learned about Jesus in a way he never had before. He learned that what we do here on earth is a launch pad for the way we will spend our future. Levi listened intently and began to realize why he was struggling so much. He knew that he wanted to focus his future life work on things that would help people for eternity not just work away each day to fill his pockets and heart with the things the world had to offer. Recognizing that worldly riches are fleeting, Levi praised God for showing him that His wisdom is for all who ask and is much better than our own wisdom that leads us astray. Peace flowed through the college student as he joined the others in worship knowing that God had a plan and purpose for his life. The monetary payment received for daily work never compares to the eternal wages we receive when living the life God has ordained for us. Money is a tool we can use for God not the means to care for ourselves.

Questions for Today: How do you choose what you will do with your day? As you decide what your life work will be, do you focus on how you can please God and lead others to know the One True God or do you get concerned about the money needed to pay the bills and which job will get you the ability to have the most toys? Are your motives pure as you work each day?

Prayer for Today: Heavenly Father, Thank You for creating each one of us with a special purpose. Thank You for putting an ability to do things that will draw others to You within each of us. Please help us to remember that worldly riches are fleeting and may deceive us into thinking we don't need to rely on You. Please forgive us for the times when we fail to keep eternity in mind and miss opportunities. In Jesus' Name, Amen.
