

And being in Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he sat at meat, there came a woman having an alabaster box of ointment of spikenard very precious; and she brake the box, and poured it on his head. Mark 14:3

This touching story of how Jesus was anointed before His crucifixion carries a beautiful illustration that has ministered to me time and again. I have wondered why the alabaster box needed to be broken when Mary could have simply opened it and poured out the nard; (extremely expensive and precious perfume which might have been Mary's dowry). One commentator said that she refused to use that box for any other purpose after anointing Him. That would make sense if it was Mary's dowry because it would be an expression of a bridal vow to Jesus and no one else. But whatever the motive in her heart, Mary's example speaks powerfully of the total devotion and commitment her soul had for Jesus, her will to give the best of everything she had; and it speaks of brokenness followed by anointing and its beautiful fragrance. So I believe this act is an illustration meant to encourage every devoted soul whose offering of herself brings circumstances which "break" her. The fragrance of perfume following the breaking "fills the room".

Broken people "smell" different. Their humility and love are an ambiance that is unmistakable. Being broken before the Lord affects everyone around...as the Apostle Paul taught in 2 Corinthians 2:15, we are a fragrance of Christ to God among those who are saved and those who are perishing; And Paul was a broken man. We should never be ashamed to be broken, even if we are criticized by those around us, as Mary was. The Lord's commendation of her has traveled around the world for 2,000 years and inspired millions of believers in circumstances that break them. God will not deny a broken heart and a contrite spirit. When we offer ourselves and our most precious things, whether they be material, personal, dreams, longings, loved ones, or our very destinies, on the altar of sacrifice, it is then that God's anointing will be greatest upon us. It will pour out of us like the ointment from that broken alabaster box — and His pleasure in us will "fill the room". 
But he knoweth the way that I take: when he hath tried me, I shall come forth as gold. Job 23:10

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A Word to the Wise - Wisdom's Way, Worth, and Weight of Judgment

"Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths. Be not wise in thine own eyes: fear the LORD, and depart from evil." Proverbs 3:5-7

Throughout the book of Proverbs Solomon regularly calls his son (and his readers) to remember godly teaching, cherish it, and apply God's instruction to his life – constantly reminding us of the blessings which follow obedience and the destruction that rebellion brings. Joseph Benson, one of the earliest commentators of Wesley's Methodism, introduced this third chapter thusly:

"This chapter,' says Henry, 'is one of the most excellent in all this book: both for argument to persuade us to be religious, and for directions in religion.' We are exhorted to be constant to our duty, because it is the way to be happy, ver. 1-4. To live a life of dependence upon God, because it is the way to be safe, ver. 5-7. To keep up the fear of God, because it tends to health and comfort of body and mind, ver. 7, 8. To serve God with our substance, because it is the way to prosper, ver. 9, 10. To bear our afflictions patiently, because, if we do so, we shall be profited by them, ver. 11, 12. Highly to value, diligently to seek, and always to govern ourselves by the rules of wisdom, because it will be followed with continual peace and comfort, ver. 13-26. To do all the good we can, and no hurt to our neighbor, because in proportion as men are just and charitable, or otherwise, they shall receive of God, ver. 27-35. By which it appears, what a tendency true religion has to make men both blessed themselves, and instrumental of communicating blessings to others."

I can offer no better advice than to read through this chapter with Benson's words in hand, recognizing the vast importance of Wisdom's Way (v. 1-12), Wisdom's Worth (v. 13-20), and Wisdom's Weighty Judgment (v. 21-35). In the remaining space, I'll give short comment on my three point outline.

Wisdom's Way: It requires complete commitment; we dare not walk indecisively in her path (James 1:5-8). If we will trust the LORD with ALL, refusing our own ways, God will give us sound direction and stable ground on which to walk. It brings us to a righteous fear of God, refusing evil – anything contrary to Him. If completely committed to her way we will be grateful for chastening (discipline) and correction (reproof), for it shows our sonship of the Heavenly Father.

Wisdom's Worth: Who can measure it? She brings continual contentment to the one who obtains her, both in this world and in that one to come (eternity). He who will diligently mine the treasures of God's Word will find both Wisdom and understanding, such which brings comfort beyond compare. Even though Wisdom is often learned and secured in adversity, She also blankets, with peace, those who hold her, by creating calm from our chaos, as God did at time's beginning. "As Wisdom changes human life from chaos to order so Wisdom functioned in the beginning." (Edgar Jones)

Wisdom's Weighty Judgment: In recognizing that Wisdom's Way requires complete commitment and comes with the corrective-proof of God's love; in understanding that Wisdom's Worth is immense and immeasurable; we must come to a time of decision – judgment. To help us judge rightly, this final section continues to spell out her way (counsel regarding companions) and her worth (continual care for your path). We are called to consider what is at stake should we choose to not "keep (protect, guard) sound wisdom and discretion." Before us is a warning to choose wisely by staying committed to Wisdom's Way, choosing her above all, and to deal carefully in our many relationships with others. We are even warned to not envy the wicked man because, in the last four verses, we see God's holy, righteous, decisive and weighty judgment upon both those who refuse and those who choose Wisdom's way. Particularly that of the last verse: "That is the consolation of the righteous, that in the end they will be honored by the Lord in the presence of the whole world; this thought enables them to bear many of the afflictions of this present time." (Paul Kretzmann) And, "They shall be promoted, indeed, but their exaltation shall be like that of Haman, who was exalted when he was hung upon a gallows fifty cubits high. Their shame shall be conspicuous to the world, when they shall be covered with everlasting disgrace, and become an abhorring to all flesh." (George Lawson). Adam Clarke closes out with this exhortation; "The way to prevent this and the like evils, is to attend to the voice of wisdom".



Yesterday, Tomorrow, and Today

Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you. 1 Peter 5:7

John Fletcher once wrote, "Do not lose the present day by idly looking back at yesterday or foolishly antedating the cares of tomorrow; but wisely use every hour, spending them as one who stands on the verge of time, on the border of eternity, and who has his work cut out by a wise Providence from moment to moment."

It's easy to get bogged down by focusing on the wrongs, or perceived wrongs, of yesterday. It's just as time consuming to become paralyzed by the anxieties of tomorrow. Let's file these two things under the category of "time wasters." Getting "bogged down" or "paralytic anxiety" can overtake our minds on a global, national, or personal level, stealing from the present, today. That's not to say that none of our energies should be spent on searching for the truths of yesterday or attempting to correct its wrongs which can affect today or tomorrow, but neither should we ignore the blessings and needs of today.

1) We may get so bogged down with the last election that we hang our heads, thinking, "What's the use." Or we may be so anxious about the next election that we put all our hopes into a political basket. 2) The rapidity in which technology is advancing, privacy waning, and the seemingly daily revealing that our government and others are misusing this technology to spy on us can either drive us to apathy or neurosis. 3) Wars and rumors of war are constantly in the forefront or recesses of many minds. Regardless of whether it's a culture war, kinetic war, or unrestricted warfare that potentially steals our peace, sometimes it's difficult to move forward. 4) We may still feel the affects physically, emotionally, or even spiritually from the last Covid-19 "plandemic," but I urge you to neither get bogged down with the wrongs which took place nor become anxious about the next "plandemic" with which we are frequently warned. 5) Each of us have losses, trials, and temptations to deal with regarding yesterday and tomorrow. My point is this, although there are many responsibilities we have to God, friends, and family in regards to speaking and standing for truth, we must become spiritually strengthened through prayer, reading and applying the Word, and trusting in the Lord with all our heart. It's vital that we endure (spiritually) to the end. We ought not to be surprised by the numerous wrongs that take place here; Jesus warned they would come. We shouldn't be surprised by the strength we receive from the Lord; He promised to keep us and make His mighty power available to us.

Jesus encouraged us with these words: "Take heed that no man deceive you. For many shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ; and shall deceive many. And ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars: see that ye be not troubled: for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet. For nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: and there shall be famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes, in divers places. All these are the beginning of sorrows. Then shall they deliver you up to be afflicted, and shall kill you: and ye shall be hated of all nations for my name's sake. And then shall many be offended, and shall betray one another, and shall hate one another. And many false prophets shall rise, and shall deceive many. And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold. But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved. And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come." (Matthew 24:4-14) Be encouraged. It's sovereignly planned and we can endure by His grace. There IS an end. Holiness unto the Lord shall prevail.

We do not control yesterday or tomorrow, but by God's grace and strength we can control the manner in which we will handle this day. In the power of the Spirit, we can seek God's kingdom and His righteousness first and foremost in all that we do. (Matt. 6:33) With prayer and supplication we can watch with all perseverance. (Eph. 6:18) And we can refuse to be anxious about anything, "but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God." (Phil. 4:6)

Dear Reader, the Savior commands us, "Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof." (Matt. 6:34)

Oreo Pudding Dessert

1 (20 oz) pkg. Oreo's

3 small boxes Chocolate fudge instant pudding
6 cups whole milk
1 (8oz) cool whip, thawed

Break oreos into small pieces and spread in the bottom of a 9x13 dish, reserving some pieces to sprinkle on top. Mix pudding and milk in a large mixing bowl until well blended. Pour the pudding over the oreos. Refrigerate for 30 minutes. Spread cool whip over the pudding and sprinkle remaining cookies over the top of the cool whip. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

Crockpot Lasagna

1 pound of ground beef
Oven ready Lasagna noodles
1 jar of spaghetti sauce
1 1/2 cups ricotta cheese
1 1/2 cups mozzarella cheese
2 tablespoons grated parmesan cheese

Brown ground beef and drain. Pour 1 cup of spaghetti sauce into the bottom of a 4-quart slow cooker. Toss remaining sauce with beef. Place 2 uncooked lasagnas on top of the sauce in the slow cooker. Spread 1/3 of the meat mixture over the noodles. Spread 3/4 cup of ricotta cheese over the meat. Sprinkle 1/2 cup mozzarella cheese over the ricotta cheese. Add another layer of uncooked noodles, 1/3 of the meat mixture, remaining ricotta cheese and 1/2 cup mozzarella cheese. Add another layer of uncooked noodles, the meat mixture and the mozzarella cheese. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Cook over low heat for 4 1/2 hours. Or until noodles reach desired tenderness.



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1 can crescent rolls
1 lb sausage, cooked and drained
1 (8 oz.) pkg. shredded cheddar cheese
6 eggs

1/4 tsp. pepper 3/4 c. milk

½ tsp. salt

Pat crescent rolls to make thin layer on bottom of 9x13" greased pan. Place crumbled sausage on dough. Sprinkle cheese over the sausage. Beat eggs, milk, salt and pepper. Pour over cheese and meat.

Bake at 350 for 30 minutes.



Chasing The Wind

"I have seen all the works that are done under the sun; and, behold, all is vanity and vexation of spirit."
Ecclesiastes 1:14

These are the words (or the teachings) of the Preacher, King Solomon (Ecc. 1:1). As he teaches, Solomon recalls the efforts that he has gone through to understand what man's purpose is, and he ultimately concludes that "all is vanity and vexation of spirit". This phrase "vexation of spirit" is an interesting phrase as there are two major interpretations - 1. That all things on earth is an annoyance to our spirit, and 2. That everything we do is like "chasing after the wind". The general consensus among biblical scholars is that this phrase is intended to mean everything is like chasing after the wind (which ultimately would lead to an annoyance of spirit!).

Consider this for a minute - the King concludes from all of his experience, all of his wisdom, and all records of worldly works, that everything man does is like chasing after the wind. Imagine partaking in such a futile effort! To try and grasp something which will ultimately slip out your hands, if you can ever really grab it at all! Previously the Preacher stated that "The wind goeth toward the south, and turneth about unto the north; it whirleth about continually, and the wind returneth again according to his circuits." (Ecc. 1:6). He says that it doesn't matter which direction the wind travels in, it ultimately returns to its original spot just to repeat the same path! If you tried to chase after the wind, you would find yourself running in circles!

So what's the point that the Preacher is making? How can we take this perspective and place it upon our lives? What Solomon intends for us to know is this - that anything we try to do with our lives here on earth (outside of what God has called us to) will leave us empty and chasing after more. Solomon wrote at an earlier point within this chapter that "...the eye is not satisfied with seeing, nor the ear filled with hearing." (Ecc. 1:8b) - no matter how often our eye views things, it never becomes satisfied and is always intending to see more things, and likewise our ears are never satisfied through hearing, but always desire to hear more sounds. For us to chase after the wind is to try and satisfy ourselves through earthly things that will never, and can never bring satisfaction to our souls. To try and find satisfaction through our job; our wealth; our families; our volunteer work; anything outside of God's purpose for us, is to simply chase after the wind - looking to accomplish something, but never accomplishing anything of purpose.
