Have Thine Own Way, Lord

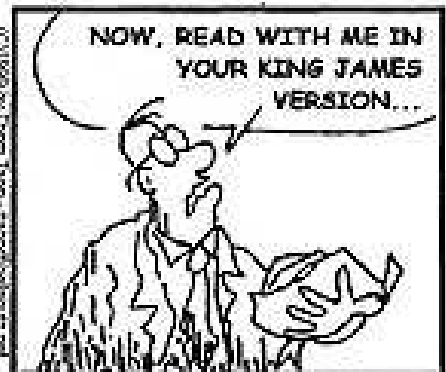
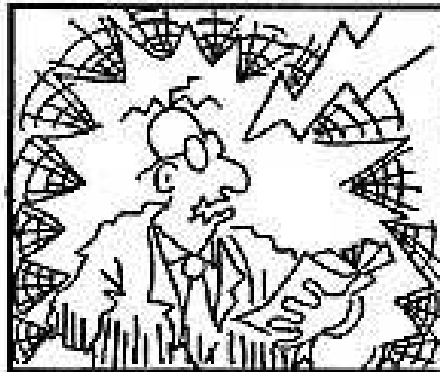
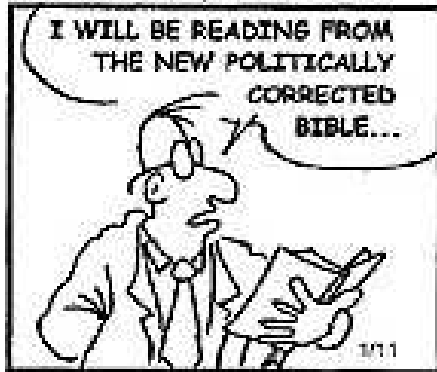
One might compare the “trials” a lump of clay must go through in the potter’s hands to the child of God as the Lord may “mold me and make me after Thy will, while I am waiting, yielded and still.” There’s the kneading of the clay, the spinning pottery wheel, the shaving, smoothing, shaping. Then it must be put into the kiln, to go through a baking process. Our disappointments, difficulties, and sorrows are used by a loving Master Potter to mold us into a vessel to be used by Him, for Him. We also go through the furnace of affliction to strengthen and complete us. Have Thine Own Way, Lord is a hymn of consecration, allowing God to do as only He can do without complaint. It’s a hymn of trust, love, and expectation.

In the early 1900s Adelaide Pollard became very discouraged while trying to unsuccessfully raise funds for a mission trip to Africa. The Master Potter – our loving Heavenly Father – knows just what we need and when we need it. He brought Adelaide to a prayer meeting where she heard just the words she needed, as another woman prayed: “It really doesn’t matter what you do with us, Lord, just have your own way with our lives.” These words were a tremendous encouragement to Pollard and her mind became focused on the story of the potter from Jeremiah 18. Verses 3-4 read: “Then I went down to the potter’s house, and, behold, he wrought a work on the wheels. And the vessel that he made of clay was marred in the hand of the potter: so he made it again another vessel, as seemed good to the potter to make it.” After returning home that evening, she wrote all four stanzas to that blessed hymn of consecration “Have Thine Own Way, Lord.”

God eventually brought her to Africa, but when World War I broke out she was forced to Scotland, and then to America where she continued to write and to speak.

Read through the whole of this wonderful hymn; notice the consecration, the trust in God, and the expectation of what He will do. Make this your prayer today.

1. Have Thine own way, Lord! Have Thine own way! Thou art the Potter, I am the clay. Mold me and make me after Thy will, While I am waiting, yielded and still.
2. Have Thine own way, Lord! Have Thine own way! Search me and try me, Master, today! Whiter than snow, Lord, wash me just now, As in Thy presence humbly I bow.
3. Have Thine own way, Lord! Have Thine own way! Wounded and weary, help me, I pray! Power, all power, surely is Thine! Touch me and heal me, Savior divine.
4. Have Thine own way, Lord! Have Thine own way! Hold o’er my being absolute sway! Fill with Thy Spirit till all shall see Christ only, always, living in me.

them for them."

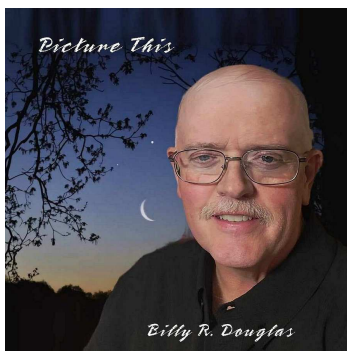

A Word to the Wise: The Wisdom of Timeliness – Prov. 10:5

“He that gathereth in summer is a wise son: but he that sleepeth in harvest is a son that causeth shame.”

Here, Solomon lifts up the wisdom of timeliness while revealing the regret, sorrow, and shame that belong to the one who is lazy, insolent, and self-centered. Sadly, the fool's family feels that shame more than the son who neglects timely duty for various forms of self-gratification.

Several American adages reflect the wisdom of timeliness shared here by Solomon. Here are a few:

“Make hay while the sun shines.” It's important to act in a timely manner. If not, opportunities are lost and we may find ourselves hungry or poor. Put off sleep or play for another day so that you can provide for family and help friends. Spiritually speaking, pray for and look for opportunities to share the gospel of Jesus Christ. Have lips of constant praise and always be ready to give an answer of the hope that lies in you – redeeming the time, for the days are evil. As Jesus said, “I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work.” (John 9:4)

“Strike while the iron is hot.” Act promptly, while an opportunity for change is still available. This is of great importance while training children or grandchildren in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. This is one reason we must discipline with action AND teaching while they are young and moldable and their conscience is tender (the iron being still hot). There is no better way to show real love to our children than to train them in Truth – the Bible. Teach them of sin; salvation; sanctification; that there's a heaven to gain, a hell to shun, and that Jesus is the ONLY way to God.

“A stitch in time saves nine.” Timely effort saves more work later. Perhaps this warning applies best to: 1. dealing with sin while it is yet a little weed to be pulled. When it grows, like weeds, it is more difficult to remove and has greater possibility of doing damage to surrounding “plants.” 2. Relationships: putting timely effort into communication, compassion, saying sorry, forgiving, humility, putting others ahead of ourselves, all these things, and others, will save more work later. These same timely words will lay the groundwork for effective evangelism as well. We can file it under “love thy neighbour as thyself.”

Dear Reader, there are several excuses one may give for “sleeping in harvest.” A few of these excuses would include having a greater desire to play, complaint of discomfort, claiming inability, some made up danger/frivolous excuse (Prov. 22:13; 26:13); according to the wise man, they all bring shame. Perhaps we are legitimately tired, let us pray and work in the Lord's strength.

If we are professing believers; if we claim to be born again Christians; if we claim Jesus as our Master and Saviour and claim heaven as our home; we must not be found as one “that sleepeth in harvest” in regard to souls. Can you hear the voice of Jesus calling, attempting to awake His church from their sleep? “Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest. And he that reapeth receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto life eternal: that both he that soweth and he that reapeth may rejoice together” (John 4:35-36).

What happens if you leave that ripe fruit or vegetable on the plant without plucking it? IT SPOILS ON THE VINE! Truly, one who uses slothful excuses in reaping souls “is a son that causeth shame.” Let us not only sow and reap; but because there is wisdom in timeliness and “the labourers are few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers into his harvest” (Luke 10:2). May we, like the disciples, GO share the GOspel and be wise sons. Pray for urgency; pray for unction; and pray to understand that the days are short.



Are You Ready?

“For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad.” 2 Corinthians 5:10

Who likes to be prepared? Maybe that's one reason many people fear the unknown – they won't know if they're prepared or not! No one likes pop quizzes; the only way to handle them is to ALWAYS be prepared! If we're wise, we prepare for things – big things and small things. Parents who love their children try to prepare their children for life; it takes diligence. We often prepare ourselves for earthly things, but how often do we prepare and encourage others to prepare for eternity? Do you remember Noah? In Genesis 6-8 God told Noah that He was sending a flood to judge the whole world, because there was so much wickedness and sin everywhere. God told Noah to build an ark to save all the animals and those who would believe. It took Noah a very long time to build that ship and during that time he preached righteousness to the people; Noah warned, but no one believed. Finally, the day came; God told Noah to get his family into the ship and God closed the door. Everyone on earth died except Noah and his family. Noah prepared for the Day of Judgment and prepared his family.

God warned the nation of Israel to “prepare to meet thy God,” because of their refusal to turn from sin. Read Amos chapter four; you'll see the many things God did to bring Israel back to Him. Instead, they continued in their sin and idolatry. All the bad things that had happened to Israel were not just judgment against them, it was a mercy – a means of grace – to turn them back to God, their only hope.

Does a fish know he's wet? Like the society in Noah's day, like the nation in Amos' day – Do we know what sin is? Being surrounded by sin and the acceptance of sin, do we know sinfulness from righteousness? We can't know by culture; we can't know by law; we can't even know by the church in many cases today. We can only know by the Bible. Psalm 119:105 tells us, “Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path.”

Beyond worldwide judgment – like in Noah's day – and which will come again at the end of time; beyond national judgment that comes upon all nations which reject God; each person needs to be prepared for eternity personally. Hebrews 9:27 warns us that each and every person WILL stand before Jesus after they die. “And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:”

Jesus has gone to prepare a place for all those who trust in Him and repent – turn away from their sinful ways to live a life of righteousness. He welcomes them with these words given in Matthew 25:34. “Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world:” And there's also a place for unprepared people. Jesus will say to them: “Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire.” (Matt. 25:41) The choice is ours. Bible study, prayer, Christian fellowship, and an unconditional surrender to the Lord, Jesus Christ is essential for eternity with Him. These are not just a legalistic checklist of things to fulfill; it's a life to be lived BECAUSE we love God and are grateful for His grace in sending Jesus to die on the cross for our sin and because we believe in that wonderful gift of eternal life offered by Jesus' sacrifice. There's no other way into heaven except through Him. “...I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.” (John 14:6)

Be like Noah: Be prepared, prepare your family, and warn others.



Reesie's Recipes



Strawberry Earthquake Cake

- 1 box white cake mix
 Ingredients required by cake mix
 (usually water, oil, and eggs)
 1 cup strawberries, chopped
 1 (8 oz) cream cheese, softened
 1/2 cup unsalted butter, melted
 4 cups powdered sugar
 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
 1/2 cup coconut flakes
 1/2 cup white chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease a 9x13 inch baking dish. Prepare the cake mix according to package instructions. Gently fold in the chopped strawberries. Pour the batter into the prepared baking dish. In a medium bowl, beat together the cream cheese, butter, powdered sugar, and vanilla extract until smooth. Drop spoonfuls of this mixture over the cake batter. Sprinkle coconut flakes and white chocolate chips over the top. Bake for 40-45 minutes, or until the cake is set and the edges are golden brown. Allow the cake to cool before serving. The top will have a beautiful cracked, earthquake effect with delicious pockets of cream cheese and strawberry.

Triple Cheesy Mac

- 1 (16 oz.) loaf Velveeta cheese, cubed
 1 (12 oz.) can evaporated milk
 1 (10 3/4 oz) can cheddar cheese soup
 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
 1 (12 oz) pkg. macaroni, cooked

Cook Velveeta, milk, soup, and cheddar cheese in sauce pan over medium heat until smooth. Stir often. Add cooked macaroni and mix together.

Squash Relish

- 8 cups squash, shredded
 2 cups onion, chopped
 2 cups green bell pepper, chopped
 2 (4 oz) jars diced pimentos
 1 tablespoon salt
 2 cups white vinegar
 3 1/2 cups sugar
 1 tsp ground turmeric
 1 tsp mustard seed
 1 tsp celery seed
 1 tsp black pepper

In a large pan combined first five ingredients. Mix well, cover and let's set for 1 hour. In a separate pan combined remaining ingredients. Bring mixture to a full boil. Pour over a pan of vegetables. Bring vegetables to a full boil. Remove from heat. Spoon mixture into mason jars and seal With lids and rings. Lids will seal as the jars cool.

Note - have your jars and lids in hot water to prepare them for the mixture.



The Darkness Has Not Overcome

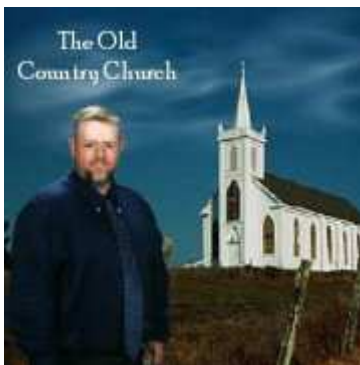

“In him was life; and the life was the light of men. And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not.” John 1:4-5

As the Apostle John opens his gospel, he begins by giving us an in-depth explanation of who Jesus is. Jesus is the Word, the one who was with God in the very beginning. He is the one who facilitated the creation of all things. He is the giver of life, the life that provided hope for all humanity. The One that caused life in the beginning became our second chance at life after the fall. John begins by reminding us of the very core of the Gospel. Before Christ we were steeped in darkness, we had not known the hope of the light for thousands of years following the fall in the garden - darkness took claim over humanity. Even when God was interacting with humanity, there was still something in the way - what we should have been able to interact with directly was instead kept out of our reach, like an artifact kept behind glass. We existed in a dark, strict, practically hopeless world.

But then Jesus came. The light we lost in the garden had returned. The hope that we lacked, the life that we had lost, was once again accessible through Jesus Christ. The light pierced through the darkness we had known for thousands of years, and the darkness “comprehended it not”. Other translations will read “the darkness has not overcome it” - the hope Jesus brought about is not capable of being overcome, no matter how hard the enemy may try.

2,000 years later, the darkness has still been incapable of overcoming the light. No matter how hopeless our world may seem, hope still abounds; no matter how much fear is brought about by humanity, security can be found; and no matter the death and destruction that appears to be at hand, life can be found. The light shines through the darkness, and the darkness cannot overcome it.

A Word for TODAY!

Verse for Today: Matthew 19:16 And, behold, one came and said unto him, Good Master, what good thing shall I do, that I may have eternal life? **Additional Passages for today:** Matthew 19:16-22; Luke 6:35-36; Ephesians 2:8-10; Acts 16:30-33

Thought for Today: "What good thing" is a strange question that is all too often not even asked. For those who do ask the question, we must recognize that eternal life can't be purchased or earned. Eternal life is a gift that is given and there is not anything that we can "do" of our own self to have it.

Story for Today: Rose quietly laid the Bible down on the dresser as she slipped quietly out of her Granddad's room. Ernie McCalister had lived a good long life but the long days and short nights had taken its toll on the elderly gentleman. Ernie had been a hard worker all of his life; not only for his boss, Mr. Jones, but also for his Savior, Jesus Christ. As Ernie slept, young Rose thought about all the things she had learned from her Granddad. He had taught her many things, like how to spit watermelon seeds and how to swim. He had also taught her how to memorize Bible passages and how to pray. Granddad Ernie loved the Lord Jesus Christ and he always showed it. Sometimes when Rose and her sister Tiffany would start to antagonize each other, Granddad Ernie always had a bit of scripture that pointed the girls in the right direction. Rose had heard of the Ten Commandments from the time she could remember and she could quote them too. However, she had lots of questions. Tiffany had decided that she wanted to enjoy life for a time. She figured she would have plenty of time when she was older to get things right with God. Rose was not sure what to do. She had read lots of verses. She heard all the stories. She had been taught how to "be good." But Rose felt empty. She felt like something was missing. And when Tiffany would taunt her, as only a sister can, her responses showed that while she was in the same book as Granddad, she wasn't on the same page. How did he not let people rile him up? How did he always respond with something kind even when others were inconsiderate and disrespectful? She had seen Granddad on his knees many times and there was nothing more peaceful than hearing him pray, unless you counted hearing him read God's words from the Holy Book. He seemed to always have just the right words for every situation. Rose wondered if she would be able to do all the things required to be a Christian like her Granddad. She wondered if she would ever be able to be good enough to make it to heaven. Tiffany sure wasn't the example she wanted to follow unless it was the example of what not to do!

Later that afternoon she asked Granddad what she had to do to have eternal life. Rose pulled out her notebook and pen to write down the list she knew would be coming. She expected to hear that she needed to read her Bible and pray along with keeping the 10 commandments. She figured she would ask how long she needed to read and pray. She also planned to ask what idols were so that she didn't accidentally bow down to them. But instead of the expected answer, Granddad asked her to read a few verses from his Bible. First, he took her to Acts and asked her to read loudly Acts 16:31. Rose read, "And they said, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house." Then he took her to Matthew 19 and explained that God isn't looking for someone to do works to get to heaven. Jesus already did all the work necessary. Jesus did what no other human could ever do. He lived a sinless life and then allowed the rulers to destroy his body while he remained faithful to the Heavenly Father. Jesus conquered death and the grave by submitting to death by crucifixion and then three days later rising again. Granddad continued, "Our job is to believe. Believe with our whole heart. Believe so that our actions show that we believe." And then he cautioned, "Rosie girl, don't keep anything back from our Lord. There isn't anything in this world, possessions, relationships, or status that can even come close to comparing to the wonder of eternal life."

Questions for Today: Have you surrendered all? Have you believed with a belief that affects your every action? If you haven't, why not do it today?

Prayer for Today: Heavenly Father, Thank You for sending Your son, Jesus Christ, to pay the price to do what was needed to be done so that we could have eternal life. Thank You for loving us so much that You sacrificed Your only son so that we could be forgiven of all our sins when we believe in Him. This we pray in Jesus' Name, Amen.
