Story Behind The Song

In the Garden

This month's story behind the song features my momma's favorite hymn. Shortly before she died, she tenderly stated, "I just want to go be in the garden with Jesus." In the Garden was written by C. Austin Miles and has been a comfort to multitudes. How could it be any different, with chorus lyrics that remind us of the close communion our Saviour has with His true people: "And He walks with me, and He talks with me, And He tells me I am His own, And the joy we share as we tarry there, None other has ever known."

I trust you'll enjoy reading C. Austin Miles' own words of his remarkable experience, as he shares the story behind the song that brought us this beautiful hymn – In the Garden.

"One day in March, 1912, I was seated in the dark-room, where I kept my photographic equipment, and organ. I drew my Bible toward me; it opened at my favorite chapter, John 20 – whether by chance or inspiration let each reader decide. That meeting of Jesus and Mary had lost none of its power to charm.

"As I read it that day, I seemed to be part of the scene. I became a silent witness to that dramatic moment in Mary's life, when she knelt before her Lord, and cried, 'Rabboni!'

"My hands were resting on the Bible while I stared at the light blue wall. As the light faded, I seemed to be standing at the entrance of a garden, looking down a gently winding path, shaded by olive branches. A woman in white, with head bowed, hand clasping her throat, as if to choke back her sobs, walked slowly into the shadows. It was Mary. As she came to the tomb, upon which she placed her hand, she bent over to look in, and hurried away.

"John, in flowing robe, appeared, looking at the tomb; then came Peter, who entered the tomb, followed slowly by John.

"As they departed, Mary reappeared, leaning her head upon her arm at the tomb, she wept. Turning herself, she saw Jesus standing, so did I. I knew it was He. She knelt before Him, with arms outstretched and looking into His face cried 'Rabboni!'

"I awakened in full light, gripping the Bible with muscles tense and nerves vibrating. Under the inspiration of this vision, I wrote as quickly as the words could be formed, the poem exactly as it has since appeared. That same evening, I wrote the music."

My mother's name was Mary; she, too, thought of Jesus as her "great Master" or "teacher" – that is what "Rabboni" means. She lived her life bowing at the feet of Jesus in service. I can only imagine what that scene may have looked like as my mother walked through death's door into the garden, falling at Jesus' feet in loving worship. In my mind's eye – if such a thing is possible – I can almost picture them walking and talking together, sharing the joy of fellowship, knowing and being known...in the garden..

Where does a born again believer go whenever they die? Do they go and sleep until the resurrection? Or do they go into the presence of the Lord? The answer is very clear if you read what the Holy Spirit wrote through the apostle Paul.

2 Corinthians 5:6-8 Therefore we are always confident, knowing that, whilst we are at home in the body, we are absent from the Lord: (For we walk by faith, not by sight:) We are confident, I say, and willing rather to be absent from the body, and to be present with the Lord.

Philippians 1:21-24 For to me to live is Christ, And to die is gain. But if I live in the flesh, this is the fruit of my labour: yet what I shall choose I wot not. For I am in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to depart, and to be with Christ; which is far better: Nevertheless to abide in the flesh is more needful for you.

We could also look at what Jesus said to the thief on the cross ..

Luke 23:43 KJV And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, To day shalt thou be with me in paradise.

These scriptures leave no doubt. Whenever a born again believer leaves this life. Their spirit and soul goes to heaven into the presence of God.

Where does a lost person go whenever they die? Someone who has not put their faith in Jesus Christ? Do they go and sleep until the judgment? Or do they go to hell? Jesus gives us the answer in Luke the 16th chapter.

Luke 16:22-24 And it came to pass, that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom: the rich man also died, and was buried; And in hell he lift up his eyes, being in torments, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.

We could also look at what Jesus said to Nicodemus ..

John 3:18 KJV He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

These scriptures leave no doubt. If you reject Jesus Christ you are condemned. Condemned to what? The judgment of hell. And whenever someone dies lost, without knowing Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Their spirit and soul goes to hell. They wake up in the flames of the damned. A place of eternal torment. **Word to the Wise – Pride’s Dangers - 04**

“Pride goeth before destruction, and an haughty spirit before a fall.” Prov. 16:18

As we finish up (Lord willing) “Pride’s Dangers,” we’ll be recovering some already travelled ground and then be speaking to God’s cure for the pride-filled life. There was an old western television series called *The Guns of Will Sonnett*. Walter Brennan played the grandfather; he would often use the phrase, “No brag, just fact,” to assert his gun skills or some other quality. Let me remind you, whatever skill or positive qualities one may have, it has come from the blessed hand of God. “For who maketh thee to differ from another? and what hast thou that thou didst not receive? now if thou didst receive it, why dost thou glory, as if thou hadst not received it?” (1 Cor. 4:7) God commands through Jeremiah: “Thus saith the LORD, Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom, neither let the mighty man glory in his might, let not the rich man glory in his riches: But let him that glorieth glory in this, that he understandeth and knoweth me...” (9:23-24) Forgetting our Creator and His goodness sets our feet on a path of haughtiness; it ripens us for a fall.

The proud and haughty look up and see themselves, the lowly and humble of spirit look up and see God. The proud look to themselves as their means of help, putting their hope in the flesh; the humble look up because their help cometh from the Lord: “I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help. My help cometh from the LORD, which made heaven and earth.” (Psalm 121:1-2) Hallelujah! The proud are content with looking to themselves and their self-righteousness for salvation; the humble and lowly look to God for salvation. They rightly see God and rightly see their own condition compared to a most holy and high God. In such thinking, let us take St. Paul’s admonition to heart: “Be not high-minded (haughty), but fear.” (Rom. 11:20)

“Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:” Phil. 2:5 The high road of pride is to take the devil’s route; it leads to the greatest of falls, to destruction. The proud have the mindset of Satan; it leads to death and hell. It is the mind of Christ which we must pursue; it is a mindset of humility, obedience, love. This path leads to life and Heaven.

The humble mind doesn’t blame others for his sin; he doesn’t blame his circumstances for his sin; and he doesn’t deny that his sin is sin. Instead, he takes responsibility for his sin, confesses his sin, and repents from his sin. You’ll remember in Genesis 3; Adam and Even had sinned, started to blame someone else for their sin, but in the end took responsibility for their sin – “And I DID EAT!” It was only after humbly confessing that they received a covering for their sin and forgiveness.

Consider the mind of pride versus the mind of humility (obedience and love) as we read this parable spoken by Jesus in Luke 18: 9-14. “And he spake this parable unto certain which trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess. And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner. I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.”

Philippians 2:5 exhorts us to have the mind of Christ; verse 8 opens that door wide, giving us the ultimate picture of humility: “And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.” Ask yourself, am I a willing and obedient sacrifice – even to the most shameful death – or do I care too much for my rights, my reputation, and my dreams? Ask God to destroy pride in your life and to, by His grace and the power of His Spirit, help you humble yourself before the Lord.



Be an “Intercessory Missionary”

In Luke 10:2, Jesus exhorted, “...The harvest truly is great, but the labourers are few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers into his harvest.”

September means school is back in session. School buses hit the road again; public, Christian, and home schoolers alike hit the books; and we, as Christians, ought to be hitting our knees in prayer. During the last sixty plus years, God, prayer, Bible reading, the Ten Commandments, and other Christian religious expressions have been a source of contention for the public schools. With the removal of godliness, we ought not to be surprised to hear of violence and criminal acts within public schools throughout our nation.

Regardless the type of school we choose to think of, there is a commonality among them regarding the many prayers that are needed: Superintendents, principals, teachers, and school boards need God’s wisdom and guidance. Pray that God would rule and overrule in the minds of even those who may be neutral or antagonistic to righteousness. Pray for the safety of teachers and students in their travels to and from school and during the school day.

May we strive to pray for the souls of the students in our area. Regardless of what is being taught in the public, private, Christian, or homeschools, and no matter what their current spiritual state, these children are surrounded by a world that is lost and depraved and Satan desires to draw them into his eternally lost grip. Let us be about the serious business of fervent, effectual prayer; such prayer will change our communities, states, and nation.

I know a man who went to his local middle school’s “Class of 2029 8th Grade Celebration.” As he looked over the list of 160 names, he felt a strong prompting to earnestly pray for each of these children who will be entering the public high school this fall. Instead of throwing the program away, which would be his usual habit, he folded it and put it into his pocket, wondering what kind of difference his commitment to pray at the beginning of the school year might make.

Two months and two days later, as he was wondering if this seemingly monumental task (after all, that’s 32 names a weekday, every week) was really from the Lord or just an impression that came from somewhere inside his head, his Heavenly Father sovereignly placed before him an excellent tract written many years ago by S.C. Todd. The title of this little tract is The Intercessory Missionary. Within it, Mr. Todd wrote of “a wonderful work of grace in connection with one of the stations of the China Inland Mission, where both the number and spiritual character of the converts had been far greater than at other stations, and yet the consecration of the missionaries at the latter had been just as great as the more fruitful place.

This rich harvest of souls remained a mystery until Mr. Hudson Taylor, on a visit to England, discovered the secret. At the close of one of his addresses a gentleman from the audience came forward to make his acquaintance. In the conversation which followed, Mr. Taylor was surprised at the accurate knowledge the man possessed concerning this Inland Station.

Mr. Taylor asked the man how he knew so much about the conditions at that particular place.

“‘Oh,’ he replied, ‘the missionary there and I are old college-mates, and for years we have regularly corresponded; he has sent me names of enquirers and converts, and these I have daily taken to God in prayer.’

“At last, the secret is found! A praying man at home, praying definitely, praying daily for specific cases among the heathen—this is the intercessory missionary.

“How different the record of missionary service would be, if each missionary on the field had such an intercessory missionary to hold up his hands!”

Every school is a mission field; each of us can be intercessory missionaries. Within many schools there are children and young people who have never seen a Bible or heard of Jesus, other than as a curse word. Within these schools are likely Christian teachers, janitors, counsellors, and parents who may find opportunities to reach these children for Jesus. Might we pray for a burden for souls.



Reesie's Recipes



Death By Chocolate Dump Cake

- 1 box chocolate cake mix
- 1 (3.9 oz) box instant chocolate pudding
- 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ cups milk
- 1 cup mini chocolate chips
- 2 cups hot fudge sauce, warmed
- 2 cups whipped cream (or whipped topping)
- 1 cup crushed Oreos (or chocolate cookie crumbs)
- Additional chocolate chips and crushed cookies for garnish

Preheat the oven to 350°F (175°C). Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish. In a bowl, whisk together the cake mix, chocolate pudding mix, and milk until smooth. Fold in the mini chocolate chips. Pour the batter into the prepared baking dish and bake for 30-35 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Let the cake cool completely. Once cooled, poke holes throughout the cake using the end of a wooden spoon. Pour warm hot fudge sauce over the cake, ensuring it seeps into the holes. Spread whipped cream evenly over the top. Sprinkle crushed Oreos and additional chocolate chips on top for garnish. Chill for at least 1 hour before serving.

Stuffed Peppers

- 1 lb. lean ground beef
- 1 medium sweet onion
- 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups cooked rice
- 2 medium/large green bell peppers
- 2 15 oz. cans tomato sauce
- 8 heaping tablespoons honey

Prepare rice, fluff, cover and set aside.

Dice sweet onion, add to large non-stick saute/frying pan with lean ground beef. Sauté beef and onion until beef is browned. Drain fat, add 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups of rice to browned beef and diced sweet onion; mix. Cut green bell peppers in half, remove caps and seeds; rinse. Pour 1 15 oz. can of tomato sauce into measuring cup and add 4 heaping tablespoons of honey and blend. Pour tomato sauce mixture over beef and rice; mix. Add second 15 oz. can of tomato sauce to measuring cup and add 4 heaping tablespoons honey; blend. Add beef and rice mixture to green bell pepper halves. Arrange in glass casserole dish. Pour tomato sauce mixture over and around stuffed bell peppers. Bake at 350°F for 1 hour.

Keep Pouring the Word

There are those of us with poor memories; we may feel, “what’s the use in reading the Bible or listening to God-glorifying messages?” Perhaps others may feel their efforts in pouring God’s Word into their children or grandchildren (adult or otherwise) is doing little to no good. I pray this short account will encourage you to “not grow weary in well doing.”

The story is told of a simple Hindu convert and a missionary who took great efforts to teach her from the Word of God. The missionary became greatly discouraged at her convert’s slowness in remembering what she had been taught. Finally, the missionary complained, “I guess it’s no use trying to teach you the Word, you seem to forget all I tell you about the Bible. Your mind seems like a sieve. As fast as I pour the water in, it runs out again.” The reply of the poor Hindu convert revealed a great truth, one we should strive to retain. She said, “Yes, I realize my mind is like a sieve. I do forget so much, but when you pour water through a sieve it makes the sieve clean, even though it seems to retain none of it. I am sorry I forget so much, but please don’t stop pouring the Word into me. It makes my heart and mind feel so clean afterwards. The water is not wasted.”


To this I would add, if you’ve ever poured water through a sieve, have you noticed that there are droplets of water which stick? After washing a sieve, it’s not as easy to dry as one might expect. It’s not so much about how much Scripture you memorize, but rather how much it does to you and in you.

We are promised in Isaiah 55:1; “So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it.”

A Word For Today

Verse for Today: Galatians 5:19-21 Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.

Additional Passages for today: Matthew 5:19; Ephesians 4:31; 5:10-13; Romans 7:5; 8:13

Thought for Today: The works that you do will produce fruit. Those who have works of the flesh shall not inherit the kingdom of God.

Story for Today: Brenda was in over her head. Never had she imagined that day months ago when Amy invited her to go out for a cup of coffee that she would end up here. At first, Amy seemed like a fun-loving girl without a mean bone in her body. Then, while most of the days were fun, there was just a comment about skulls not being bad and how impossibly old-fashioned some people were to automatically assume she was bad for wearing them, or something similar to that. Now that she could look back, she could see how little words here and there and events that had progressively become more wicked had been a slippery slope. The crystals and other seemingly harmless trinkets were accepted until, before long, she realized that she was being controlled. She went to gatherings where they played music that really spoke to her. The words were different and made her feel strange. She had started strong, defending her faith when something was said that didn't seem right. But after a while, she quit speaking up, not wanting the battle and twisting of her words that made everything come out wrong. She didn't think she believed the same as Amy. While Amy professed a faith in God, it appeared her god wasn't the God of the Bible. Every day, Brenda felt herself slipping farther and farther from all that she had believed. Some weekends, they would plan a camping trip or something special that kept them out of church, and it had gotten easier and easier to miss Bible study. It seemed every time she was scheduled to go, Amy showed up with something planned. She had seen Amy do some pretty amazing things. Amy seemed to have powers that no one else that Brenda knew had. She could see into the future and talked often about seeing things that no one else could see. She would say a quick "prayer" on the way to the store and would have an empty parking space right by the front door waiting for her. Brenda was very impressed at first. Then, as she learned more and more things, she became increasingly uncomfortable. But how could she get out? It was like she was trapped. Every day, Amy was calling or stopping by and encouraging her to meet up or go to a gathering. This last meeting was way too intense, and the ritualistic animal sacrifice was beyond anything she had ever thought she would be involved in. Today, as she read her Bible, she came across the words of Paul in Galatians 5. How could Amy think she was going to heaven? It was pretty clear that she was working for the flesh and that her practices were indeed witchcraft. That last phrase, "they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God," left her knowing that she had to get out. She began by praying and asking God to forgive her. Then she began collecting all the trinkets to dispose of them. When Amy called, she refused the invite and instead spent time reading the Bible and sought after God's desire for her life. Brenda called Joyce from her Bible study group and shared her concerns. Together they prayed and made a plan to help Brenda. They also prayed for Amy and for the others who were caught up in witchcraft.

Questions for Today: How about you? You may not have slipped into witchcraft like Brenda did, but have you crucified the flesh, or do you allow some of the works of the flesh to manifest in you? Do you allow worldly desires to have a place in your mind that no one else even knows about? Do you have hatred in your heart against someone that you just can't forgive? Do you see any of the works of the flesh listed in Galatians 5 growing in your life? Do you recognize them in others?

Prayer for Today: Dear Heavenly Father, Thank You for Your truth. Thank You that You provide a way of escape when temptations come. Thank You for loving us and giving us a way to be restored by allowing us to walk in the Spirit and be led by the Spirit. Thank You that Your mercies are new every morning and that You can forgive all of our sins. Thank You that we do not have to remain in bondage to the flesh. Thank You for freedom in Christ Jesus. Please free us from the bonds of flesh, whether they be manifestations that others can see or only You. In Jesus' Name, Amen.
